# **August** Feature Presentation **Annis Clapp**

Presenting - Quilting in the New Millennium

Our speaker for the August 9, 2011 meeting is Annis Clapp. Annis has had a passion for sewing since she was a child, and has been designing and making quilts and related items since the mid '70s. While making her son's wedding quilt in 1998-99 she became interested in quick piecing techniques. The discovery of rag quilts in 2001 led to 3 quilt books published by Leisure Arts. She has had quilts featured in McCall's Quick Quilts and Ricky Tims' Kool Kaleidoscope Quilts. Her desire for speed and accuracy in her piecing skills led to the development of a seam guide in 2003 which is now availabel through C & T Publishing.

She will be sharing a trunk show of a few of her first quilts, discussing the piecing methods used, then moving on to the year 2000 and beyond with a variety of quilts from miniature to king size, sharing her fabric selection process, block piecing techniques, and inspiration.






**Workshops are held** at Pleasant Ridge Church of Christ Family Pavilion in Arlington. Located at I20 & Little Road NW of the Southwest Plaza Shopping Center.

### **Annis Clapp Workshop Information & Supply List**

The workshop on Saturday, August 13, is the Pinwheel Star block with a pieced border. Annis will be teaching her reverse paper piecing technique for piecing the blocks. No turning the paper over, holding it up to a light, or wasting chunck of fabric! She will also demonstrate an alternative method for piecing the star block units without paper using her Ultimate Seam Guide and adhesive guide bars. A surprise bonus block will teach picture piecing using her foundation paper piecing technique and there will be a quick lesson for drafting your own paper pieced blocks from a block printed from EQ7. Whether you are new to foundation paper piecing or have been doing it for years using traditional methods, you will be amazed at how easy it is to piece many block styles and sizes quickly and accurately.

#### Pinwheel Star -- Class Supply List

- 1. Pinwheel Star Workshop Pattern (includes foundation template copies) \$5.00.
- 2. Fabric (5-6 fat quarters). Light for background Medium, Dark, and Bright or Contrast for star and pieced border additional fabrics for inner border, cornerstones and outer border.
- 3. Ultimate Seam Guide recommended but not required Must be installed on your sewing machine before class. For more detailed installation instructions there is a tutorial on my website: www.amc-quilts.com. I will have alternate seam guides for you to borrow during class if you don't want to purchase one. This seam guide works best on an extension table or large sewing surface.
- 4. Sewing machine in good working order with open toe walking foot and extension cord. (Pfaff owners with dual-feed use open toe applique foot.) If you don't use a walking foot, this technique will be more difficult to do and may require pinning all of the pieces so they don't shift.
- 5. Size 90/14 needle for paper piecing.
- 6. Thread to blend with all fabrics.
- 7. Rotary cutter, small mat, and rulers. (largest square is 7 1/4" and longest strip is 16")
- 8. Narrow ruler for trimming seams. (I use an Olfa QR-1x12 ruler.)
- 9. Basic sewing supplies scissors, fine pins, seam ripper, etc.
- 10. Stapler, scrapbooking tape, tweezers.

### ~~ Nancy's Block Party Corner ~~

This is a MONTHLY Challenge! There is a new block pattern each month. Members may make as many blocks as they choose. We would like for each member attending the meeting to turn in a least one block. These blocks are collected at the meeting. Members get one ticket for each block turned in, placed in a box for a drawing. The member whose name is drawn, get all the Block Party blocks turned in. If there are 24 blocks turned in, 2 names will be drawn. We could have MORE winners if EVERY member in attendance turns in at least ONE block. We Average -- 60+ in attendance -- that would be 5 winners!!!

I have another challenge for you. Use the pattern to make the Block Party block. Then choose some fabrics to make another block each month. Keep this block. Although unable to attend, my heart remains with you. It has been a wonderful experience to kno you all and represent Project Linus. Thank you all so much for supporting a worthwhile charity.

We have a new liaison, Liz Cooper, who will accept donations, etc. I will still answer questions, ser items to the newsletter, and send Thank You cards, unless you elect not to receive one. NOTE: Please put your name on Liz's list next to your donation. (If you are not yet in the directory, please include your phone number(s) and full address also.)

Project Linus has given out over 28,000 quilts since beginning local, and 1,000 to Japan's earthquake/tsunami victims. We have also sent a slightly smaller number to the Joplin, Missouri tornado survivors.

Our wish list is for finished quilts 40" X 44", tops and backs 40" X 44", blocks of any size and number, 50" pieces of fabric, cash and stamps. Quilts may be tie-tacked, every four inches with cotton daily crochet thread.



#### **Quilters' Guild of Arlington Celebration Block**







#### Makes One Twelve Inch Finished Block

Please review all instructions before making the block. Must be a light star in dark/medium background, block may be no larger than 12.5".

#### Need:

- 1. FABRIC A 4.5" x 36" MEDIUM TO DARK
- 2. FABRIC B 2.5" x 20", plus 4.5" square **LIGHT** that is suitable for name to be seen, no strong prints; 200 ct. muslin or plain fabric is suggested.
- 3. Batting 13" square
- 4. 13-14" square backing fabric
- 5. Binding fabric two 40 42" widths of fabric; cut 2.5" strips, miter for one strip, double fold

#### **Cutting Instructions**

\*If you are going to heavily quilt, embellish or appliqué the block you may want to cut the pieces 4.5"x 5", then square up block to 12.5". Be careful to put star points on 4.5" side.

- Cut 8\* 4.5" squares of medium to dark fabric FABRIC A
   If using a fat quarter, cut along short side (18") must be at least 18"; two strips of 4.5".
   This will allow for 13" square for backing.
- 2. Cut 1\* 4.5" square light fabric FABRIC B You may wish to embroider your name and 'Member Since' line before constructing the block
- 3. Cut 8 2.5" squares of same light fabric FABRIC B
- 4. Cut 1 -13-14 " square of backing fabric, may be same as A or different
- 5. Cut two 3" squares of either your backing or binding material, for 'hanging corners'
- 6. Cut 1 13 " square batting
- 7. Cut two (2) widths of fabric (40-42") cut 2.5" strips for binding.

#### Assembling Block - sew all seams with 1/4" accurate seam width

- 1. The star points are made using the stitch and flip method: Place a 2.5" sq. of fabric B in the comer of A with the right sides of the fabrics facing each other. With a pencil and ruler, mark a diagonal line on B from the corner to comer as shown. Sew on the line.
- 2. Trim patch 1/4" from sewn line. Press it gently to corner.
- 3. Repeat with another B patch on adjacent comer to create star points. Make total of 4 matching units for each of the star point units.
- 4. Join the matching units into rows with A patches as shown above; press the seams allowances toward the A's; middle row to B patch. Sew the rows together to complete the star block.

#### **Finish**

- 1. Quilt the block. You may embellish and quilt as desired to personalize your block! It cannot be larger than 12.5" square, so do nothing to extend size or 'dangle' off block.
- 2. Please make two 'hanging comers', see below for instructions.
- Sew on the binding to the block.
- 4. Sign block in at least 3/4-1" lettering in middle of center square with permanent fabric pen or embroidery. Include this line under your name: *Member Since* fill in year you joined QGOA!

#### Hanging Corners - Corner Triangles for Hanging a Small Quilt

- 1. Cut two 3" squares of your backing or binding material.
- 2. Fold in half diagonally. Press.
- 3. Align the folded triangles on the back of the quilt to the TOP right and left comers, raw edges even. Pin. Double check you placed the corners on the top corners!
- 4. Sew on the binding in your usual method.

# **Second Try**

**Fall Colors** 

Light & Medium -

Cut a strip 2 1/2 in. by 19 in.

Light -


Cut 4 -- 3 1/4 in. squares

Dark -

Cut 1 3/4 in. wide strip the width of the fabric. It will take about 31 in. to frame the light squares on two sides.

Dark -

Cut a 4 1/2 in. square







Sew light and medium strips together, press seams to the dark fabric. Cut into 4 1/2 in. pieces.

Stitch the 4 -- 3 1/2 in. squares to the dark strip. Cut apart and press seam to the dark. Repeat on the adjacent side. Cut apart and press seam to the dark side.

Lay out and assemble according to the diagram.

**Soldier Blocks** - Use red, white and blue.

**Project Linus Blocks** - Use white and light blue. Construct 6 1/2 unfinished 9 patch blocks from fabrics, using 2 1/2 in. squares.
