2012 Board Spotlight Pat Madrid

Our spotlight this month falls on Pat Madrid who happens to be our current guild librarian. Pat has also served in the past as secretary for 2 years. Pat has been quilting for almost 5 years. Her first real quilt was a small sampler quilt that she made while attending a six week long "How to Quilt" class at Joann's. Fortunately, the instructor was Terrie Kelley, who encouraged Pat to attend the Quilter's Guild of Arlington. Terrie is still Pat's teacher and continues to offer encouragement.



When asked who her favorite quilt author or designer is, Pat said she loves them all ("If you could see the amount of books I have in my personal library at home, you would agree.") Currently she is intrigued with Judy Niemeyer and her paper piecing techniques, each one a stepping stone to improve her skills.

Pat feels she struggles with every technique. She is a "show me" kind of girl - doing better if she can see someone doing the technique. Hand work is the hardest technique for her. She appreciates the beauty, difficulty and amount of work involved, but it's not for her. Pat likes paper piecing because of the accuracy. The points are pointy and the curves are curvy!! "It makes me look like I know what I'm doing!"

"If I have a style, it would be doing something different each time. There are a thousand different ways to make a quilt and I have only tried a few. That is one of the great things about quilting, I never get bored. There is always something new and different to try."

A few years ago Pat was asked her favorite color scheme and it was red. Now it is scrappy. She loves 1930s reproduction fabrics and batiks. Her rotary cutter is her favorite tool. She uses the seam ripper the most and has become an expert. Pat loves being productive, making something that will last past me and is full of love and prayers.

"When my grandson was 2 years old, Elmo was his hero. So, of course, I made him a life size Elmo quilt for Christmas. When he opened his present, I got the reaction that we all want when we give quilts as presents. He went to the quilt and hugged Elmo, his new best friend."

Pat also enjoys painting with watercolors, ceramics, crochet, sewing garments, and cross stitch.

"I retired 5 years ago from the Federal Bureau of Prisons as Associate Warden of Industries and Education. It was a great career, but retirement has been wonderful. Now my days are filled with grandkids and quilting. Who knew retirement could be so much fun!"





Just in..... 2013 Quilt Festival Theme is..... "ALL THINGS GREEN" 2013 Quilt Show Chairman -- Judy O'Polka

Quilt Block For Quilt Show Chair Judy O'Polka



Diamond in a Square 8 ½" unfinished Block Material - Civil War Reproduction Fabric

1. Cut: 1 - 6" Square for Center

Correction: on #2 -- It should read:

2. Cut: 2 - 4" Squares for Corner Triangles.

Cut 2 - 5" Squares for Corner Triangles

- 3. Cut each 4" Square on the diagonal making a total of 4 corner triangles. Mark the mid-point of the long side of each triangle by folding in half and pinching the crease.
- 4. Mark the mid-point of each side of the center square in the same way.
- 5. Sew a triangle to one side of the square, taking care to match these mid-points. Note that the points of the triangle will project about ½" beyond the sides of the square. Turn back triangle and press. Trim away the points.
- 6. Sew the other 3 triangles to the remaining sides of the square in the same way to give a "square-on-point. This completes the block.



Block Party 2012 October Halloween Half Squares 3 Fabrics: Orange, Black and Halloween Print


Orange = Orange Green = Halloween Print Stripes = Black

Orange and Black: cut strips 4" x 8" Black and Print: cuts strips 4" x 16" Orange and Print: cut strips 4" x 8"

Lay the pairs of strips right sides together. Mark off 4 inch squares and

mark a zigzag pattern. Stitch a quarter inch seam on each side of the zigzag line. Cut apart on the drawn lines. Press to the darker fabric and square up to 3 ½ inches.

Lay out according to the diagram.



Patriotic/Wounded Warrior Block

Make with the same block in red, white and blue.

Linus Project

Use 2 ½ in squares to make 9 patch blocks.







You may choose any color for your quilt. The "Prairie Claw" is shown as a scrap quilt and the cutting requirements are given to you in a scrap variety form. Cut all strips selvage to selvage.

Please have these cut, labeled and bagged:

 $15 - 2\frac{1}{2}$ " light or background squares

1 ½" strips any color family...make sure you have a contrast color to your above background squares. Cut a total of 30 of these. Label as "Option 1" and place in a baggy.

Cut 6 - 27/8" light or background squares. Label as "Option 3" and place in a baggy.

Cut 12 - 3 3/8" squares from the same color you chose for your $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " strips. You may make these all the same or chose a variety of colors. Label and mark in a baggy.

Cut 24 –rectangles 2 x 3 3/8" as background or light. Label and mark in a baggy.

Cut 12 -- 2" square from the same colors you chose for the 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips and 3 $\frac{3}{8}$ "

squares. You may make these all the same color or chose a variety.

IN CLASS, we will work on 3 blocks (12 inch) from page 19 of Square in a Square book.
