Jodi Barrows' unique method called Square in a Square, has touched thousands of quilters throughout the world. Her point of view gives quilters the freedom to create many quilt designs with speed and accuracy.

Jodi has spoken to quilting audiences throughout the United States, Canada, Australia, Italy and South Africa. She has appeared as a guest on several quilting shows. She has written twenty-four books, four novels, produced four tools, two video/DVDs and five teacher's books. She has a series of pattern books and fabric lines based on a series of fiction novels that were written from the 1856 time period about the Mailly women. This series is based on the women in Jodi's family.



Jodi will be our speaker for the November meeting and will be our Workshop teacher on Nov 14. The workshop supply list is on page 18.

2012 Board Spotlight Sherry Livingston

This month's spotlight falls on our Publicity chairman, Sherry Livingston. Sherry has been quilting for 16 years. Her first quilt was for the arrival of her first grandchild. Her grandmother and the quilters of her family have passed away and there was no one to make the baby quilt. She could

not imagine not having a handmade family quilt for the new baby and felt that she had to learn how to quilt and carry on the quilting tradition.

Sherry loves Susan Crenshaw and her Texas landscapes and scenes. Susan Crenshaw's machine applique, machine quilting and thread are class is Sherry favorite class in the past 5 years. Chain piecing has been the easiest technique to master, while Cynthia England's picture piecting technique of detailed landscapes the most difficult to master. Sherry's favorite quilt patterns usually involve a medallion, star, or center piece with blocks building around the center of interest. She likes this because the center star or medallion is usually large and creates a center of interest that the eye can travel around the quilt and come back to the center and rest.

When asked if she had a signature style or theme, Sherry said, "I don't believe I have a signature style or theme yet. I am still working on this but plan to use the quilt as a canvas with a painterly approach. Hand and machine applique will definitely be part of the design technique."

Sherry's favorite colors are turquoise and purple. Batiks, solids, and florals are the fabrics she tends to purchase. Her favorite quilt tool is the "True Cut", a lipped ruler and rotary cutter by Grace Co.

"Being around other quilters is the best part of being a quilter. Quilters are the most down to earth, sincere people you can meet. One of my first retreats with the QGOA was to the Compass Center and Paula Barnes of Bonnie Blue Quilts was teaching at the retreat. I didn't have a clue that she did Civil War/antique quilt reproductions. I purchased bright purple, hot pink and yellow fabric to bring to the retreat. I was embarrassed when I saw that everyone had Civil War reproduction fabric but my fellow quilters assured me that I could do anything (well almost anything), in any color I wanted to my great relief."

Sherry also paints on canvas using oil and acrylics. Since she started quilting her time is spent more and more in quilting because she finds quilting both challenging and rewarding...."and quilters are absolutely the most fun!"

Sherry was born in Dallas but has spent most of her life in Arlington. She has been married to the love of her life, Len for 26 years and they have a beautifully blended family of 4 children and 12 grandchildren. Sherry recently retired after a 30 year career with Lockheed Martin, a total of 40 years in teh business world and 20 years of attending college part-time at night, majoring in Business and Art. Her passion is color in every form, cloth or paint. Believing that color is food for the soul, she has saturated herself in the happiness of color since she retired and hope to continue doing so for a long time!



2013 Quilt Show Chairman -- Judy O'Polka

Quilt Block For Quilt Show Chair Judy O'Polka



Diamond in a Square 8 ½" unfinished Block Material - Civil War Reproduction Fabric

1. Cut: 1 - 6" Square for Center

Correction: on #2 -- It should read:

2. Cut: 2 - 4" Squares for Corner Triangles.

Cut 2 - 5" Squares for Corner Triangles

- 3. Cut each 4" Square on the diagonal making a total of 4 corner triangles. Mark the mid-point of the long side of each triangle by folding in half and pinching the crease.
- 4. Mark the mid-point of each side of the center square in the same way.
- 5. Sew a triangle to one side of the square, taking care to match these mid-points. Note that the points of the triangle will project about ½" beyond the sides of the square. Turn back triangle and press. Trim away the points.
- 6. Sew the other 3 triangles to the remaining sides of the square in the same way to give a "square-on-point. This completes the block.




Block Party 2012 November

Thanksgiving Half Squares

2 Fabrics: Cream and Brown Print

Cream and Brown Print: 1 - 4 in. by width of fabric strip from each fabric



Lay the pairs of strips right sides together.

Mark off 8 - 4 inch squares. Mark a zigzag pattern across the strip.

Stitch a quarter inch seam on each side of the zigzag line.

Cut apart on the drawn lines.


Press to the darker fabric and square up to 3 ½ inches. Lay out according to the diagram.

Patriotic/Wounded Warrior Block

Make with the same block in red, white and blue.

Linus Project

Use 2 ½ in squares to make 9 patch blocks.





Square in a Square ruler and Square in a Square book 1

A sewing machine

You may choose any color for your quilt. The "Prairie Claw" is shown as a scrap quilt and the cutting requirements are given to you in a scrap variety form. Cut all strips selvage to selvage.

Please have these cut, labeled and bagged:

 $15 - 2\frac{1}{2}$ " light or background squares

1 ½" strips any color family...make sure you have a contrast color to your above background squares. Cut a total of 30 of these. Label as "Option 1" and place in a baggy.

Cut 6 - 27/8" light or background squares. Label as "Option 3" and place in a baggy.

Cut 12 - 3 3/8" squares from the same color you chose for your $1\frac{1}{2}$ " strips. You may make these all the same or chose a variety of colors. Label and mark in a baggy.

Cut 24 –rectangles 2 x 3 3/8" as background or light. Label and mark in a baggy.

Cut 12 -- 2" square from the same colors you chose for the $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " strips and $3 \frac{3}{8}$ " squares. You may make these all the same color or chose a variety.

IN CLASS, we will work on 3 blocks (12 inch) from page 19 of Square in a Square book.
