

September 11 - Winnie Fleming - "Borders"

Winnie's expertise lies in the challenge of mathematically figuring the size of borders, "floater" borders, mitering borders, and making scrap quilts. Through her intensive studying of various quilt blocks and borders, she has developed no-fail formulas for every quilter to calculate the exact cutting size for adding "floater" and mitered borders to their own specific quilt. While most quilters would shy away from the math of quilting, Winnie takes all the fear away and makes it quite easy and fun. The result is enhanced borders, increased confidence, and a true sense of pride and satisfaction.

BLOCK PARTY

Thrifty Block 7 due July Block size 12 ½"

Directions are provided for two sizes but only the 12 ½" block is required for Block Party.


Colors: Black, White and Red

Blacks can be black and white and white can be white with black and then any red.



6 inch block		12 ½" block	
Red	cut 4 2 ½" squares	cut 4	4 ½" square
Black	cut 1 2 ½" square	cut 1	4 ½" square
Black	cut 8 1½" squares	cut 8	2 ½" squares
White	cut 8 1½" squares	cut 8	2 ½" squares

Make 4 four patches for a 12 ½" block *Watch direction* of blacks when sewing block.




Assemble the block

Sew in rows

Row 1: Four patch - red square -

four patch



Row 2: Red square - Black square - Red square



Row 3: Four patch - red square - four patch



Make sure 4 patches are facing the correct direction.

Sew row 1 to row 2 then row 2 to row 3.

Monthly Block Party Information:

This is a monthly challenge with a new block pattern each month printed in the newsletter. There are several ways to participate:

- 1. You can make the block and bring it to the next meeting. Each month a name is drawn for the winner of the blocks that month. You can only get the number of blocks that people participate that month.
- 2. If you are like me and never win anything, we have started a group of twelve that make blocks each month. At the end of the year we have a drawing to win one set of 12 blocks. This is a good way to make friends, make something new, and maybe have 12 blocks ready to make a quilt.
- 3. If you do not want to win blocks, make the block in Red, White and Blue each month to be donated to someone to make Wounded Warrior guilts.
- 4. You can make the same block to donate to the Ronald McDonald House project.
- 5. You can also make nine patch blocks to be donated to Project Linus.

Peanut Butter Cake

Shared by Carol Ramsey

2 c sugar

4 eggs

1 c butter

1 c peanut butter

2 ½ c flour or cake flour

2/3 c buttermilk

2 tsp. vanilla

2 tsp. baking soda dissolved in 1 c boiling water

Cream together sugar, butter and peanut butter. Add eggs, one at a time beating well after each addition. Add flour, buttermilk and vanilla. Stir in water with added soda last. Bake at 350 in 9 X 13 pan for 25 mins.

Peanut Butter Icing

½ c peanut butter

1 lb box confectioner's sugar

7 to 8 T milk

1 tsp. vanilla

Combine and spread on cooled cake.

Double Fudge Brownies

1 pkg. fudge brownie mix

1/4 cup vegetable oil

1/4 cup prepared coffee

1 egg

1 (16 oz.) pitted cherries in syrup, drained and chopped

1 (12 oz.) pkg. semi-sweet chocolate morsels

Preheat oven to 350.

Combine brownie mix, oil, coffee and egg in bowl until just moistened. Stir in cherries and chocolate morsels.

Spoon mixture into a 13x9x2-inch baking dish coated with cooking spray. Bake for 25-30 minutes. Cool before cutting into squares.


