

Winnie's expertise lies in the challenge of mathematically figuring the size of borders, "floater" borders, mitering borders, and making scrap quilts. Through her intensive studying of various quilt blocks and borders, she has developed no-fail formulas for every quilter to calculate the exact cutting size for adding "floater" and mitered borders to their own specific quilt. While most quilters would shy away from the math of quilting, Winnie takes all the fear away and makes it quite easy and fun. The result is enhanced borders, increased confidence, and a true sense of pride and satisfaction.

#### **BLOCK PARTY**

#### Sweet Broderie Pinwheels by Rosalie Quinlan Designs

Due October meeting

Block size 7 ½" Directions for 2 blocks

#### Colors:


Have a lot of contrast in your two fabrics. You have to make 2 blocks and the contrast is what makes the blocks work.

Fabric A: Cut 1 strip of fabric 2 ½" wide by 40" Fabric B: Cut 1 strip of fabric 2 ½" wide by 40"

1. Sew the two strips of fabric together. Press.



- 2. Cut the above strip into 8 squares each measuring 4  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 4  $\frac{1}{2}$ "
- 3. Place 2 squares on top of each other, right sides together, flipping one square to match Fabric A on top of Fabric B and the other with Fabric B on top of Fabric A
- 4. Rule a diagonal line from the top left corner to the bottom right corner. Sew together 1/4" either side of the traced line. Cut along traced line.





- 5. Open square and press to reveal two squares.
- 6. Repeat with remaining squares. Rearrange to form 2 complete double pinwheel blocks. Sew blocks together.

#### **Monthly Block Party Information:**

This is a monthly challenge with a new block pattern each month printed in the newsletter.

There are several ways to participate:

- 1. You can make the block and bring it to the next meeting. Each month a name is drawn for the winner of the blocks that month. You can only get the number of blocks that people participate that month.
- 2. If you are like me and never win anything, we have started a group of twelve that make blocks each month. At the end of the year we have a drawing to win one set of 12 blocks. This is a good way to make friends, make something new, and maybe have 12 blocks ready to make a quilt.
- 3. If you do not want to win blocks, make the block in Red, White and Blue each month to be donated to someone to make Wounded Warrior quilts.
- 4. You can make the same block to donate to the Ronald McDonald House project.
- 5. You can also make nine patch blocks to be donated to Project Linus.



#### Susan FitzGerald President Block for 2013

Materials: Brights and Black solid (no color in Black)

Scrappy Choice—cutting instructions

Dark Batik (a bright color) for Fabric A

Cut 5 2 1/4" squares

Cut 4 2 7/8" squares (HST)


Light Batik for Fabric B

Cut 4 2 1/4" squares

Black for Fabric C

Cut 8 2 1/4" squares

Cut 4 2 7/8" squares (HST)



#### Preparation:

#### Half Square Triangle (HST)

Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of each of the Fabric A 2 7/8" squares. Place Fabric A 2 7/8" square and a Black 2 7/8" square right sides together. Stitch  $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from the drawn line on both sides.



Cut the square on the drawn line to yield 8 HST squares. Press the seam allowance toward Fabric A. Trim the HST to  $2\frac{1}{4}$ ".

Stitch a 2 1/4" Black square between two HST blocks. Make 4.





Set 2 aside.

Add a Black 2 1/4" square to each end of HST units to make the top and bottom rows of block.

#### 9 Patch Block

Lay out five 2  $\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric A squares and four 2  $\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric B squares. As shown.
