



BLOCK PARTY

Rocky Road to California 12 1/2" Block


Fabric Selection:

Dark Green Cut 2 $4\frac{1}{2}$ " squares Blue Cut 1 strip $2\frac{1}{2}$ " X 15 $\frac{1}{2}$ "

Cream Cut 1 strip 2 ½" X 15 ½"

Beige/Lt cream Cut 2 4 7/8" squares for H.S.T. units Red Cut 2 4 7/8" squares for H.S.T. units


Sew blue strip to cream strip. Square up and cut 6 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " segments. Make four patch. Make 3 – 4 patch units



Red and Beige squares place right sides together and make diagonal line and sew on either side for H.S.T. Cut on drawn line. Press.

Sew in rows.

Block should measure 12 1/2"





Monthly Block Party Information:

This is a monthly challenge with a new block pattern each month printed in the newsletter.

There are several ways to participate:

- 1. You can make the block and bring it to the next meeting. Each month a name is drawn for the winner of the blocks that month. You can only get the number of blocks that people participate that month.
- 2. If you are like me and never win anything, we have started a group of twelve that make blocks each month. At the end of the year we have a drawing to win one set of 12 blocks. This is a good way to make friends, make something new, and maybe have 12 blocks ready to make a quilt.
- 3. If you do not want to win blocks, make the block in Red, White and Blue each month to be donated to someone to make Wounded Warrior quilts.
- 4. You can make the same block to donate to the Ronald McDonald House project.
- 5. You can also make nine patch blocks to be donated to Project Linus.

Susan FitzGerald President Block for 2013 Blocks due in January—Get them to Kandi

Materials: Brights and Black solid (no color in Black)

Scrappy Choice—cutting instructions

Dark Batik (a bright color) for Fabric A

Cut 5 2 1/4" squares

Cut 4 2 7/8" squares (HST)


Light Batik for Fabric B

Cut 4 2 1/4" squares

Black for Fabric C

Cut 8 2 1/4" squares

Cut 4 2 7/8" squares (HST)



Preparation:

Half Square Triangle (HST)

Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of each of the Fabric A 2 7/8" squares. Place Fabric A 2 7/8" square and a Black 2 7/8" square right sides together. Stitch $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from the drawn line on both sides.



Cut the square on the drawn line to yield 8 HST squares. Press allowance toward Fabric A.

Trim the HST to 2 1/4".


Stitch a 2 1/4" Black square between two HST blocks. Make 4.



Set 2 aside.

Add a Black 2 1/4" square to each end of HST units to make the top and bottom rows of block.

9 Patch Block

SUSAN G. KOMEN FOUNDATION MINIATURE QUILT SILENT AUCTION

Welcome to the Quilters' Guild of Arlington,

I want to make you aware of one of the many projects that the guild participates in each year. It is Susan G. Komen silent auction held at the guild's quilt show in May.

It started in 1997, QGOA members and friend began making miniature quilts to be auctioned at the annual quilt show. 100% of the proceeds from the auction are given to the Tarrant County Chapter of the Susan G. Komen Foundation, whose mission it is to eradicate breast cancer as a life threatening disease through advancement in research, education, screening, and treatment.

In 2003, a Pink Challenge category was added by then chairman, Nancy Martinson, now titled "Nancy's Pink Challenge." Nancy lost her battle with breast cancer in 2004 and "The Pink Challenge" is held each year in her memory. The membership votes on the quilts submitted for the Nancy's Pink Challenge each year at the April general meeting. Only those quilts that meet the challenge criteria are eligible.

The miniature quilts sold in the silent auction are comprised of those quilts submitted for Nancy's Pink Challenge and those submitted for the Miniature Quilt categories. <u>An entry form is required for each miniature quilt entered</u> and the rules for these quilt categories are different.

The table below compares the two categories. The highlights point out the differences:

Miniature Quilts

No block may be larger than 4"

May be whole cloth (WC) or medallion style (MS)

Must have at least 9 blocks if not WC or MS Quilts may not exceed 24" on any one side

Quilt may be any color

May be either hand or machine quilted

Nancy's Pink Challenge

No block may be larger than 3"

May **NOT** be whole cloth

May NOT be MS unless medallion is 3" and

includes 9 other 3" blocks

Must have at least 9 blocks

Quilts may not exceed 24" on any one side

75% of the quilt must be PINK

May be either hand or machine quilted
