

New Stitch Club—Dear Jane

Our Dear Jane Club (a Quilt Guild of Arlington stitch group) is based on the "Dear Jane" quilt, an 1863, Jane A. Stickle quilt. We use the book by Brenda Manges Papadakis (dearjane.com) to work approximately 4 blocks per month of the 225 quilt patterns. At the meetings we discuss how we worked the previous months' blocks and share techniques, problems, questions, show and tell, etc. Members can join-in at any time. Cost is a small donation to the church for the use of the facility and a small charge if you desire paper copies/paper piecing, etc. of the blocks each month. The members have a variety of ways to work the blocks; applique, hand piecing, machine piecing, and paper piecing. Some members use the book, software, or purchase a copy of handouts at the meeting. - 2-Enter at the main TMRC entrance off Division (1501 W Division), come up the drive and take either a left or right and go around the main complex. When you get behind the main complex, you will see Mason Dr (goes downhill slightly) with duplexes on either side of the road. As you reach the bottom of the hill, take a left just prior to exiting through the gates.

BLOCK PARTY

Rising Star 12 1/2" Block (12" finished)

Fabric Colors: Scrappy Blues

Background (light blue or blue on white)

Cut: 4 - 3 1/2" squares

1 - 7 1/4" square cut twice
Diagonally for 4 quarter-squares

4 - 2" squares

1 - 4 1/4" square cut twice diagonally (as above)

Dark blue


Cut 4 - 3 7/8" squares and cut once diagonally for 8 half-squares


Medium blue

Cut 4 - 2 3/8" squares and cut once diagonally for 8 half-squares



1 - 3 1/2" square (this can be a different medium such as a focus print)





Make Flying Geese units from the quarter-square and halfsquare units as shown. There will be four smaller units for the smaller star block and four larger ones for the large star. This is the traditional method for making Flying Geese. Feel free to make this unit in any other method that you prefer.

Assemble the block as shown.



Monthly Block Party Information:

We will continue with the groups of 12 that make blocks each month as in 2013. At the end of the year we will have a drawing and each participant should win one set of 12 blocks. It is important that each one who participates makes every monthly block so that no one will be short any blocks at the drawing in December 2014. If you don't particularly like the blocks that you win, you will have enough to make a charity quilt. If you don't want to participate in the groups you may make the blocks in Red, White and Blue each month to be donated so that someone can make Wounded Warrior quilts with them. The blocks could also be made for the Ronald McDonald House. You may also make 6"(finished) nine patch blocks in child appropriate fabrics for Project Linus.

Susan FitzGerald President Block for 2013

Materials: Brights and Black solid (no color in Black)

Scrappy Choice— cutting instructions

Dark Batik (a bright color) for Fabric A

Cut 5 2 1/4" squares

Cut 4 2 7/8" squares (HST)


Light Batik for Fabric B

Cut 4 2 1/4" squares

Black for Fabric C

Cut 8 2 1/4" squares

Cut 4 2 7/8" squares (HST)



Preparation:

Half Square Triangle (HST)

Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of each of the Fabric A 2.7/8" squares. Place Fabric A 2.7/8" square and a Black 2.7/8" square right sides together. Stitch $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from the drawn line on both sides.



Cut the square on the drawn line to yield 8 HST squares. Press the seam allowance toward Fabric A. Trim the HST to $2\frac{1}{4}$ ".

Stitch a 2 1/4" Black square between two HST blocks. Make 4.





Set 2 aside.

Add a Black 2 1/4" square to each end of HST units to make the top and bottom rows of block.

9 Patch Block

Lay out five 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric A squares and four 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric B squares. As shown.

SUSAN G. KOMEN FOUNDATION MINIATURE QUILT SILENT AUCTION



The new year is the perfect time to go through all those scrapes and use the little ones for a miniature quilt for the silent auction. You accomplish two things, cleaning out the old and contributing to an important cause!

Remember 100% of the proceeds from the auction are given to the Tarrant County Chapter of the Susan G. Komen Foundation. Keep in mind you can either make a regular miniature quilt or a Nancy's Pink Challenge miniature quilt.

The table below compares the two categories. The highlights point out the differences:

Miniature Quilts

No block may be larger than 4"

May be whole cloth (WC) or medallion style (MS)

Must have at least 9 blocks if not WC or MS Quilts may not exceed 24" on any one side

Quilt may be any color

May be either hand or machine quilted

Nancy's Pink Challenge

No block may be larger than 3"

May **NOT** be whole cloth

May NOT be MS unless medallion is 3" and

includes 9 other 3" blocks

Must have at least 9 blocks

Quilts may not exceed 24" on any one side

75% of the quilt must be PINK

May be either hand or machine quilted

An entry form and photo is required for each miniature quilt entered and only those quilts that meet the challenge criteria are eligible. The membership votes on the eligible quilts submitted for the Nancy's Pink Challenge each year at the April general meeting and all the eligible miniature quilts submitted are judged at the May show.

I know some of us think miniatures are challenging, however, I found an article that might provide some help. It also provides lots of free patterns. So check it out and get started. Miniature Quilts - Tips, Tricks and Free Patterns
