The July program will feature Terrie and her method for increasing from 2 or 3 fabrics to 300 in a quilt.

It will be held again at the wonderful facilities at the Pleasant Ridge Church of Christ, in southwest Arlington.

There is a limit how many will be able to attend and how many tables we will be able to use.

We will have 50 table spaces at \$40 each and 15 spaces at \$30 for those that will not need a table, or are able to bring their own personal table(s) to

use. Plenty of chairs for everyone!

I will arrange the tables so the end positions will be for the non-table users, so if you want to bring hand work or your own table you will still be grouped with friends!

Sign-ups will begin at the July 8 guild meeting for members only. Registration by mail will be available the next day - if you mail a registration form, it will not be opened until the 9th. Also at the meeting you will be able to register one guild member friend, but those present will be first on the list. So if it fills up with those present then the additional members and mailed forms will be on the wait list.

Use any color scheme and techniques you would like, but please do not use any embellishments.

Sign your unfinished block on the font with a permanent marker. Please include your name and your location.





BLOCK PARTY

Prairie Queen 12 1/2" (finished (12 ")

Fabrics:

Dark: Medium to Dark blue Cut - One 4 1/2" square

Two 4 7/8" squares and cut once diagonally for four half-square triangles

Medium: Red

Cut - One 2 1/2" X 22" strip

Light: White or white print with red and or blue

Cut - One 2 1/2" X 22" strip

Two 4 7/8" squares and cut once diagonally for four half-square triangles

Piecing directions:


Stitch the white and red strips together and press toward red.


Sub-cut into eight 2 1/2" segments. Sew these into 4 four-patch units.


Stitch the blue and white triangles to form 4 half-square triangles units. Press toward the dark.

Assemble as shown above, pressing toward the four-patch units.

Note: You could also reverse the red and blue fabrics to have blue and white four-patches and red and white half-square triangles for a slightly different look.







Monthly Block Party Information:

We will continue with the groups of 12 that make blocks each month as in 2013. At the end of the year we will have a drawing and each participant should win one set of 12 blocks. It is important that each one who participates makes every monthly block so that no one will be short any blocks at the drawing in December 2014. If you don't particularly like the blocks that you win, you will have enough to make a charity quilt. If you don't want to participate in the groups you may make the blocks in Red, White and Blue each month to be donated so that someone can make Wounded Warrior quilts with them. The blocks could also be made for the Ronald McDonald House. You may also make 6"(finished) nine patch blocks in child appropriate fabrics for Project Linus.

Materials: Brights and Black solid (no color in Black)

Scrappy Choice—cutting instructions

Dark Batik (a bright color) for Fabric A

Cut 5 2 1/4" squares

Cut 4 2 7/8" squares (HST)

Light Batik for Fabric B


Cut 4 2 1/4" squares

Black for Fabric C

Cut 8 2 1/4" squares

Cut 4 2 7/8" squares (HST)

This is the 2013
Presidents
Blocks that were due in June. The new pattern for 2014 will be up soon!



Preparation:

Half Square Triangle (HST)

Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of each of the Fabric A 2.7/8" squares. Place Fabric A 2.7/8" square and a Black 2.7/8" square right sides together. Stitch $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from the drawn line on both sides.



Cut the square on the drawn line to yield 8 HST squares. Press the seam allowance toward Fabric A. Trim the HST to $2\frac{1}{4}$ ".

Stitch a 2 1/4" Black square between two HST blocks. Make 4.





Set 2 aside.

Add a Black 2 1/4" square to each end of HST units to make the top and bottom rows of block.

9 Patch Block

Lay out five 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric A squares and four 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric B squares. As shown.

You all are so generous with your time and talents it is impossible to express the depth of appreciation from Project Linus so children can receive comfort from your kindness. And if I missed your contribution I beg your patience, it is always so hectic at meetings and I really try to acknowledge every gift. If you will help me by pinning your name or something with your info onto your donation, it will be a great help to me (those many little address labels are always helpful).

This year Snowball Express is here again and will be held in Ft. Worth. So keep in mind kids of deceased military. They are like all other kids and like cartoon figures and bright colors. That deadline will be in November so there is plenty of time to complete a project. Last year Linus donated 400 quilts/blankets to Snowball Express at the meeting in Dallas.

We have monthly donations to hospitals and many other child facilities in Tarrant County with a minimum of 50 quilts each. So all your creations are well appreciated by children in need.

We meet the 2nd and 4th Thursdays of most months so checking the website at Projectlinus.org should have info on our Tarrant Chapter. We bring our machines and notions, lunch bag, drinks and any donations we have or show and tell. Ronald McDonald Challenge 2014-2015

We have chosen the fabric for the 2014-2015 challenge and already received the fabric from Lone Star House of Quilts. We have decreased the number of "kits" due to decreased participation last year. We will have 24 kits available (well, actually 22 since we will participate, also).

We are working on revising the guidelines for the Spirit of the Challenge Award. Hopefully, by the time we get to the July meeting with the kits, we will have the details ironed out. In general, quilts should be at least 50" long per side, square or rectangle. If intended for a very young child, it should not have any buttons or other detachable embellishments. All quilts turned in by the appointed deadline (to be determined) will be eligible for ribbons for 1st, 2nd, 3rd & Honorable Mention.

As I said, the Spirit of the Challenge guidelines are being revised.

We had some really great quilts this past year and hope to see more for next year's show.
