A big thanks to Jolene Mershon, Janice Mowery, Ouida Bost, Jean Dodson, Judy Liston, Dottie Hughes, Janice Farris, Randa Dillon, Nancy Spell, Sherry Livingston, Pat Madrid, and other anonymous contributors. Also thanks to Patsy Martin, Robbie Colley, Annis Clapp, Jaye McLaughlin, Kay Olsen, Darnell Dark, and (I think I wrote) Jane Owens. My apologies if I can't read my own writing. Many of those gifts were taken to Cook Children's for distribution in September.

What a gift to see a child with a serious illness run across the atrium to choose a blanket to cuddle and love. For all the children that receive a blanket stitched by loving, compassionate hands please accept their thanks via Project Linus.

Project Linus is asked to make a contribution to Snowball Express which will be collected near the end of November. Snowball Express serves children with a deceased parent that served in a branch of the Armed Forces. They suggest any child friendly pattern or design and wanted to let you know that some of the kids are larger kids.

Project Linus meets the 2nd and 4th Thursdays at Southcliff Baptist Church off Granbury Road and I 20. Project Linus can use finished quilts, fleece blankets, blocks, tops, fabric, batting, etc., including sewing notions.

The hospitals prefer kid quilts measuring approx. 44x45 and quilts for larger kids approx. 44x57.

Let me know if you have news to share with the membership.



BLOCK PARTY

Water Wheel (12" finished)

Main Fabric: Reproductions (Civil War/1800s)

Main Print (Medium/Dark): Cut one 4 1/2" square, two 4 7/8" squares and cut once diagonally for 4 half-square triangles and cut four 2 1/2" squares




Medium light: Cut four 2 1/2" squares

Light (background): Cut two 4 7/8" squares and cut once diagonally for four half-square triangles,

and cut eight 2 1/2" squares







Assembly: Stitch the main print triangles to the light triangles to make four half-square units. Make 4-patch units from the 2 1/2" squares as shown above, paying close attention to the placement of the 3 fabrics as you stitch the blocks together. This is important to make the blocks spin correctly. I have included a diagram of the blocks stitched block to block which makes a very interesting pattern.

Monthly Block Party Information:

We will continue with the groups of 12 that make blocks each month as in 2013. At the end of the year we will have a drawing and each participant should win one set of 12 blocks. It is important that each one who participates makes every monthly block so that no one will be short any blocks at the drawing in December 2014. If you don't particularly like the blocks that you win, you will have enough to make a charity quilt. If you don't want to participate in the groups you may make the blocks in Red, White and Blue each month to be donated so that someone can make Wounded Warrior quilts with them. The blocks could also be made for the Ronald McDonald House. You may also make 6"(finished) nine patch blocks in child appropriate fabrics for Project Linus.


