

# **BLOCK PARTY**

## Fox and Geese (12" finished)

Fabrics: Christmas (traditional reds and greens)

Main Print: Any Christmas Print with traditional reds and greens

- Cut one 6 7/8" square and cut once diagonally for


two half-square triangles

Medium: Red or green to blend with main print

- Cut two 3 7/8" squares and cut once diagonally for

four half-square triangles

- Cut four 3 1/2" squares



Light: Light print with green and/or red to blend with main print:

- Cut one 6 7/8" square and cut once diagonally for two half-square

triangles

- Cut two 3 7/8" squares and cut once diagonally for four half-

square triangles

Assembly: Make two half-square units from the main print and light large triangles and four half-square units from the smaller triangles then assemble the block as shown.













## Monthly Block Party Information:

We will continue with the groups of 12 that make blocks each month as in 2013. At the end of the year we will have a drawing and each participant should win one set of 12 blocks. It is important that each one who participates makes every monthly block so that no one will be short any blocks at the drawing in December 2014. If you don't particularly like the blocks that you win, you will have enough to make a charity quilt. If you don't want to participate in the groups you may make the blocks in Red, White and Blue each month to be donated so that someone can make Wounded Warrior quilts with them. The blocks could also be made for the Ronald McDonald House. You may also make 6"(finished) nine patch blocks in child appropriate fabrics for Project Linus.
