March Meeting Margie Peyton Making Memories Through Quilts

Margie Peyton is the owner of Sew So Easy Quilt Shop in Saginaw, TX and a regular vendor in our quilt shows. She designs patterns and creates kits and will have them for sale at the February meeting. You can tell she loves playing with pattern and color in her shop and on her quilts. In her own words, you will see why she calls her program "Making Memories Through Quilts".

"I started guilting as a child. My mother made string guilts from leftover scraps. We used newspaper squares for the foundation and it was my job to tear the paper off after piecing. I learned from my mother that a quilt was something to be treasured. It was made from pieces from our lives and no scraps were ever to be wasted. In those days we tied the quilts with embroidery floss as there was never enough time for hand quilting. It was not until the 70's that I first tried hand guilting and applique. In 1995 I started designing guilt patterns for beginners. I currently have six patterns. Over the years my love of guilts has done nothing but grow. I am always eager to try new methods and over my 50 plus years of guilting have tried just about every technique. I started teaching classes for beginner and experienced guilters hoping to spread my joy of guilts in 2011 when I decided that I needed a change of scenery and left my accounting job to open my guilt shop in Saginaw, Texas. And I am loving it and the many wonderful people that I have met there."

"Friendship Garden"

The 2015 Donation Quilt Charity is SafeHaven.

"Friendship Garden" was adapted from designer Kim McLean's "Hearts and Flowers" pattern found in Kaffe Fassett's *Quilt Romance* book. It was used with permission from Kim. The pattern was redesigned, pieced, and quilted by Nancy Spell with appliqué help from the Friendship Stitchers group.


The center medallion focal point heart is inset with scalloped, pieced, and appliqué borders featuring a "Reflection" motif. The 90"X90" quilt was constructed using a mix of Kaffe Fassett's 100% cotton fabrics.

QGOA Celebration Block





This block is to 'Celebrate' each member at our Festival of Quilts. We ask each member to make one of these 12" blocks with your name and 'Member Since' to celebrate you and what you add to the Guild. You can personalize this block however you want - embroidery, beading, and or quilting. If you do not remember when you joined the guild just look in the directory and figure out the first guild president you remember! The blocks will be placed on the end of the standards each year.

Makes One Twelve Inch Finished Block

Please review all instructions before making the block. Must be a light star in dark/medium background, block may be no larger than 12.5".

Need:

- 1 FABRIC A -4.5" x 36" -MEDIUM TO DARK
- 2 FABRIC B -2.5" x 20", plus 4.5" square -**LIGHT** that is suitable for name to be seen, no strong prints; 200 ct. muslin or plain fabric is suggested.
- 3 Batting -13" square
- 4 13-14" square backing fabric
- 5 Binding fabric -two 40 -42" widths of fabric; cut 2.5" strips, miter for one strip, double fold

Cutting Instructions

*If you are going to heavily quilt, embellish or appliqué the block you may want to cut the pieces 4.5"x 5", then square up block to 12.5". Be careful to put star points on 4.5" side.


- 1 Cut 8* -4.5" squares of medium to dark fabric -FABRIC A If using a fat quarter, cut along short side (18") <u>must</u> be at least 18"; two strips of 4.5". This will allow for 13" square for backing.
- 2 Cut 1* -4.5" square light fabric -FABRIC B You may wish to embroider your name and 'Member Since' line before constructing the block
- 3 Cut 8 -2.5" squares of same light fabric -FABRIC B
- 4 Cut 1 -13-14 " square of backing fabric, may be same as A or different
- 5 Cut 1 -13 " square batting
- 6 Cut two (2) widths of fabric (40-42") cut 2.5" strips for binding.

Assembling Block -sew all seams with 1/4" accurate seam width

- The star points are made using the stitch and flip method: Place a 2.5" sq. of fabric B in the corner of A with the right sides of the fabrics facing each other. With a pencil and ruler, mark a diagonal line on B from the corner to corner as shown. Sew on the line.
- 2 Trim patch 1/4" from sewn line. Press it gently to corner.
- 3 Repeat with another B patch on adjacent corner to create star points. Make total of 4 matching units for each of the star point units.
- 4 Join the matching units into rows with A patches as shown above; press the seams allowances toward the A's; middle row to B patch. Sew the rows together to complete the star block.


Finish

- 1 Quilt the block then bind. You may embellish and quilt as desired to personalize your block! It cannot be larger than 12.5" square, so do nothing to extend size or 'dangle' off block.
- 2 Sign block in at least 3/4-1" lettering in middle of center square with permanent fabric pin or embroidery. Include this line under your name: Member Since -fill in year you joined QGOA!
- 3 Blocks will be accepted September, 2008 ~ April, 2009. Blocks will be retained by QGOA for future exhibits.

April—Thirties Star (12" finished block)



Fabrics: Thirties fabric, any color, white tone on tone

Thirties Fabric, any color: One 3-1/2" square

Two 4" squares for half square triangles

Two 5-1/2" squares for quarter square triangles

White tone on tone fabric: One 3-1/2" square

Two 4" squares for half square triangles

Two 5-1/2" squares for quarter square triangles

- To make half square triangles, draw a diagonal line on the back of the white squares. Place a white square right sides together with each of the batik squares. Stitch a ¼" seam on either side of the diagonal line.
- Cut along the diagonal line, and press open
- Square to 3-1/2". You will have one extra half square triangle
- To make the quarter square triangle, make two more sets of half square triangles. Draw a diagonal line on the back of two of the half square triangles. Place right sides together with another half square triangle set as shown:



Stitch $\frac{1}{4}$ " on either side of the diagonal line, then cut along the diagonal line and open out and press. Trim to 3-1/2". Repeat with the remaining set of half square triangles.

Assemble squares as shown.

Remember it's not too late to start a mini for the Nancy's Pink Challenge. Members will vote on their favorites at the April meeting.

I am so excited, **tickled pink** actually, hearing about all the fabulous miniatures members are creating for the Susan G. Komen Miniature Auction. It is not too late to make a mini to donate for the challenge and the mini auction. So gather up your scraps and start having fun getting those creative juices flowing. How exciting it would be to participate or even win the pink challenge along with the knowledge you are helping in the fight against breast cancer.

The miniature quilts sold in the silent auction are comprised of those quilts submitted for the Nancy's Pink Challenge and those submitted for the Miniature Quilt categories. An entry form along with a picture of the entry is required for each miniature quilt entered and the rules for the two quilt categories are different.

The table below compares the two categories.

Miniature Quilts	Nancy's Pink Challenge
No block may be larger than 4"	No block may be larger than 3"
May be whole cloth (WC) or medallion style (MS)	May NOT be whole cloth, May NOT be MS unless medallion is 3" and includes 9 other 3"blocks
Must have at least 9 blocks if not WC or MS	Must have at least 9 blocks
Quilts may not exceed 24" on any one side	Quilts may not exceed 24" on any one side
Quilt may be ANY COLOR	75% of the quilt must be PINK
May be either hand or machine quilted	May be either hand or machine quilted
