She lives in Arlington, Texas with Don, her husband of 42 years, and their Husky-mix Glory. They have four children and six grandchildren.

Hi all: Hope everyone had a lovely and filling Memorial Day Remembrance. Been sort of a slow month for Linus. We had to postpone a meeting but that made our collection the next meeting more delightful. Project Linus donates several hundred quilts/blankets every month. The local hospitals (JPS, Cooks, Harris) receive donations regularly from Linus and their needs do not diminish. Many other locations that receive these donations are: ACH (formerly all church), Snowball Express, AIDS outreach, and many others. Sadly we have children suffering treatments, operations, and all sorts of medical ailments for which they can receive a quilt that one of our members has shopped for a pattern, fabric batting, cutting, sewing, sandwiching and quilting. Our desire to make a gift of comfort will hopefully help the little and bigger kids find healing. Linus has blankets for all children from 0-18years of age.

Special thanks to Jolene Mershon for darling kits, Sherry Livingston for a fleece edged blanket, Janice Farris, Robbie Colley, Rose Redding, Nancy Spell, Janice Mowery, Darnell Dark, Jill Matyastik, and anonymous. My apologies if I missed your name. It does help if you can pin your name to your donation if possible. Linus wants to acknowledge your contribution. So accept the thanks from Linus and me for the children that received your kind donations.

Project Linus meets the  $2^{nd}$  and  $4^{th}$  Thursday of most months at SouthCliff Baptist Church located at 4100 SW Loop 820 . We meet from 9-3ish in their entryway. We gather to assemble quilts, and sew them. Sometimes we even have a class for a new pattern. We have show and tell and enjoy all the newest quilts. One of the Linus blanketeers took a class on embroidery and brought in a panel quilt with dinosaurs in all manner of behavior. We commiserate with one another and just sew to our hearts content.

#### Mystery Round Robin

Now that you have your 12-1/2" center square, and your first border that includes half-square triangles, let's talk about a floating border.

A floating border is often a strip of fabric that is used to make a pieced border fit. If your half-square triangles were 2" square, you now have a 16" square medallion. Let's say your next pieced border is 18" long, you'll want to add a floating border so it will fit. With smaller dimensions it's pretty easy to figure, because for this scenario you'll want a 1" border all the way around. But as your quilt grows, it can be more complicated to figure, especially if you're working with a rectangular quilt, rather than a square quilt.

There is a nifty formula you can use, and it's really quite easy. I'm math phobic, but I have learned to trust the math, and it really works!

You'll want to go ahead and make whatever pieced border you are going to make, just be sure to make it larger than each side of the center you're adding it to. Here's the formula:

#### Square Quilt

((Length of pieced border without corner block — width of quilt)  $\div$  2) +  $\frac{1}{2}$ " seam allowance = cut size of floating border

#### Rectangular Quilt

((top and bottom pieced border without corner block — width of quilt)  $\div$  2) +  $\frac{1}{2}$ " = size to cut the side floating borders

THEN

((side borders without corner blocks — length of quilt)  $\div$  2) +  $\frac{1}{2}$ " = size to cut top or bottom floating borders

For July, add a floating border and any kind of pieced border you'd like.

#### President's Block

To show appreciation for our past president's, guild members make a block of the president's choosing to give to her. Barbara Cain, our president in 2015, has decided on a Bow-Tie Block, in shades of blue or gray on a white or white on white background. These blocks will be going into a quilt for a boy, so please use fabrics that are not overly feminine. The block should measure 6-1/2" unfinished.

Directions are below:

#### White Fabric

Cut two 3-1/2" squares

#### Blue / Gray Fabric

- Cut two 3-1/2" squares
- Cut two 2" squares

#### Sewing Instructions

- Draw a diagonal line on the back of the 2" squares
- Place the 2" squares right sides together with the white squares, matching one corner.



• Stitch along the diagonal line, and fold back, matching corners. Trim seam allowance to 1/4". Make 2.



Assemble your squares to make block.

## Stencil Marking

Instead of using a marking pencil with a quilt stencil, I use a foam paintbrush. I dip it into loose chalk, and dab it over the stencil. It's really quick!
Fons & Porter Tip: Use a chalk marker, chalk pencils, or a white mechanical pencil to mark your quilt when piecing or marking free-hand quilting designs. Use a quilt pounce for quilting stencils.

## Churn Dash (8-1/2" unfinished block) June 2016

Fabric 1: Cut two (2) 4" squares for half square triangles

Cut four (4) 2" x 2-1/2" rectangles

Fabric 2: Cut two (2) 4" squares for half square triangles

Cut four (4) 2" x 2-1/2" rectangles


Fabric 3: Cut one (1) 2-1/2" square for center

Assemble half square triangles and square to 3-1/2". (Instructions for making HSTs are on the Block Party Webpage at the top of the page. The link is <a href="http://qgoa.org/blocks/BlockPartyHalfSquareTriangles.pdf">http://qgoa.org/blocks/BlockPartyHalfSquareTriangles.pdf</a>).


Assemble 4 units made of one each of the rectangles.

Assemble following the diagram.

#### Make 1 block.



#### **QGOA Celebration Block**





This block is to 'Celebrate' each member at our Festival of Quilts. We ask each member to make one of these 12" blocks with your name and 'Member Since' to celebrate you and what you add to the Guild. You can personalize this block however you want - embroidery, beading, and or quilting. If you do not remember when you joined the guild just look in the directory and figure out the first guild president you remember! The blocks will be placed on the end of the standards each year.

#### Makes One Twelve Inch Finished Block

Please review all instructions before making the block. Must be a light star in dark/medium background, block may be no larger than 12.5".

#### Need:

- 1 FABRIC A -4.5" x 36" -MEDIUM TO DARK
- 2 FABRIC B -2.5" x 20", plus 4.5" square -**LIGHT** that is suitable for name to be seen, no strong prints; 200 ct. muslin or plain fabric is suggested.
- 3 Batting -13" square
- 4 13-14" square backing fabric
- 5 Binding fabric -two 40 -42" widths of fabric; cut 2.5" strips, miter for one strip, double fold

#### **Cutting Instructions**

\*If you are going to heavily quilt, embellish or appliqué the block you may want to cut the pieces 4.5"x 5", then square up block to 12.5". Be careful to put star points on 4.5" side.


- 1 Cut 8\* -4.5" squares of medium to dark fabric -FABRIC A If using a fat quarter, cut along short side (18") <u>must</u> be at least 18"; two strips of 4.5". This will allow for 13" square for backing.
- 2 Cut 1\* -4.5" square light fabric -FABRIC B You may wish to embroider your name and 'Member Since' line before constructing the block
- 3 Cut 8 -2.5" squares of same light fabric -FABRIC B
- 4 Cut 1 -13-14 " square of backing fabric, may be same as A or different
- 5 Cut 1 -13 " square batting
- 6 Cut two (2) widths of fabric (40-42") cut 2.5" strips for binding.

#### Assembling Block -sew all seams with 1/4" accurate seam width

- The star points are made using the stitch and flip method: Place a 2.5" sq. of fabric B in the corner of A with the right sides of the fabrics facing each other. With a pencil and ruler, mark a diagonal line on B from the corner to corner as shown. Sew on the line.
- 2 Trim patch 1/4" from sewn line. Press it gently to corner.
- 3 Repeat with another B patch on adjacent corner to create star points. Make total of 4 matching units for each of the star point units.
- 4 Join the matching units into rows with A patches as shown above; press the seams allowances toward the A's; middle row to B patch. Sew the rows together to complete the star block.

#### **Finish**

- 1 Quilt the block then bind. You may embellish and quilt as desired to personalize your block! It cannot be larger than 12.5" square, so do nothing to extend size or 'dangle' off block.
- 2 Sign block in at least 3/4-1" lettering in middle of center square with permanent fabric pin or embroidery. Include this line under your name: Member Since -fill in year you joined QGOA!
- 3 Blocks will be accepted September, 2008 ~ April, 2009. Blocks will be retained by QGOA for future exhibits.
