Summer exhibits bring the heat of creativity!

LA GRANGE, TEXAS – June 13, 2016 – For its next installation of exhibits, the Texas Quilt Museum is going on the fringe, staying in the square of tradition, and taking a little wild trip with its three new collections. They will be on display from June 30-September 25, 2016.

Con the Fringe: Innovative Art Quilts from California and Nevada" features 20 art quilts by members of the Studio Art Quilt Associates (SAQA) in those regions. The works represent the unique character of the west coast in a variety of diverse materials, subjects, and surface design techniques.

Connotations of "fringe" include areas on and near the Pacific Rim, looking toward Asia; the geography and topography of California and Nevada as western limits of the continental United States; and, artists pushing the boundaries of their medium.

"This exhibition exemplifies some of the more interesting work being done today by SAQA members," says Museum Curator Dr. Sandra Sider, who also juried this exhibit

Finally, "*Ruby Jubilee*" includes 21 red-and-white quilts that were previously on display in 2014 to celebrate the 40th - or "ruby"-anniversary of the International Quilt Festival in Houston. Hanging from the ceiling, they created quite an impact. It was inspired by the "Infinite Variety" exhibit which was shown in 2011 in New York.

Museum co-founder Karey Bresenhan will give a talk on the Ruby Jubilee exhibit on July 9, 3 p.m. Free admission begins at 2 p.m. Also, Curator Dr. Sandra Sider will give a lecture "Contemporary Quilt Art in U.S. Museums: Is There a Trend?" on Sept. 10, at 3 p.m. Free admission begins at 2 p.m.

Dear Ones,

This month as was last month and the months to come, Project Linus gives quilts of comfort to children suffering from horrid illness or ongoing treatments or birth defects, etc. Tarrant County is privileged enough to have outstanding facilities to help these children (Cooks, JPS, AHC, CASA, Catholic Charities, Harris, AIDS kids outreach , Rainbow room, Safe Haven, Snowball Express, Sundance) . And we truly are privileged because we have a choice, we can make our quilts at our leisure and shop for fabric or pattern or thread to make a gift for them. Our work is volunteer and that is our gift. So whatever your contribution to your community every bit of our work is needed and goes to those who have no choice. It takes so many volunteers to coordinate all the services, bookkeeping, driving, sorting, assembling, quilting, knitting, crocheting, and many more. So I stress volunteer because no one is paid or reimbursed for their job. You and your friends do this work for nothing other than a sincere thank you from the recipients and parents. Each of you is needed and appreciated.

So special thanks to Janice and David Mowery, Jolene Mershon, Darnell Dark, Happy Johns, Jane Owens, Carol Ramsey, Debra Ware, Mary Lopes, and Rose Redding will soon have 5 new fleece blankets ready for us soon. So to each of you that has given a quilt, blanket, supplies and those working on things for the future, Project Linus appreciates your diligence. Time is our most valuable asset and each of you is a treasure.

Project Linus meets 2nd and 4th Thursdays of the month. We meet at 4100 S.W. Loop 820 in Ft. Worth at SouthCliff Baptist Church. We meet from 9-3. We sew fabric sandwiches, piece, assemble sandwiches, and several times a year the coordinator has a trade day. We have classes several times a year when a demonstration where a new or quick quilt design is explained. We have sewers, assemblers, tie-ers, crocheters, knitters all working in the same entry way of Southcliff that allows us to work in their facility.

Please join us when possible. Bring your machine or thread along with a sack lunch. We park in the outer places so that we don't consume all their close-in places. You can drive to the circle drive and unload and then park. We would love to have you join us in this effort for children. If you are unable to spend the day with us but have a donation, please come by and drop it off and see what a beehive of activity we have.

The hospitals prefer quilts/blankets measuring: Finished size: 40" x 44" for the smaller kids Finished size for older kids: 57" x 44"

Project Linus is happy to accept donation of completed quilt/blankets, fabric, and any sewing notions or accessories. Please bring blocks or tops, notions, fleece, crochet. or knit blankets.

Quilters' Guild of Arlington Celebration Block







Makes One Twelve Inch Finished Block

Please review all instructions before making the block. Must be a light star in dark/medium background, block may be no larger than 12.5".

Need: 1. FABRIC A - 4.5" x 36" - MEDIUM TO DARK 2. FABRIC B - 2.5" x 20", plus 4.5" square - LIGHT that is suitable for name to be seen, no strong prints; 200 ct. muslin or plain fabric is suggested. 3. Batting - 13" square 4. 13-14" square backing fabric 5. Binding fabric - two 40 - 42" widths of fabric; cut 2.5" strips, miter for one strip, double fold

Cutting Instructions

*If you are going to heavily quilt, embellish or appliqué the block you may want to cut the pieces 4.5"x 5", then square up block to 12.5". Be careful to put star points on 4.5" side.

Cut 8* - 4.5" squares of medium to dark fabric - FABRIC A If using a fat quarter, cut along short side (18") must be at least 18"; two strips of 4.5". This will allow for 13" square for backing.

Cut 1* - 4.5" square light fabric - FABRIC B You may wish to embroider your name and "Member Since" line before constructing the block

Cut 8 - 2.5" squares of same light fabric - FABRIC B

Cut 1 -13-14 " square of backing fabric, may be same as A or different

Cut two 3" squares of either your backing or binding material, for "hanging corners"

Cut 1 - 13 " square batting

Cut two (2) widths of fabric (40-42") cut 2.5" strips for binding.

Assembling Block - sew all seams with 1/4" accurate seam width

- 1. The star points are made using the stitch and flip method: Place a 2.5" sq. of fabric B in the corner of A with the right sides of the fabrics facing each other. With a pencil and ruler, mark a diagonal line on B from the corner to corner as shown. Sew on the line.
- 2. Trim patch 1/4" from sewn line. Press it gently to corner.
- 3. Repeat with another B patch on adjacent corner to create star points. Make total of 4 matching units for each of the star point units.
- 4. Join the matching units into rows with A patches as shown above; press the seams allowances toward the A"s; middle row to B patch. Sew the rows together to complete the star block. Finish
- 1. Quilt the block. You may embellish and quilt as desired to personalize your block! It cannot be larger than 12.5" square, so do nothing to extend size or 'dangle' off block.
- 2. Please make two "hanging corners", see below for instructions.
- Sew on the binding to the block.
- 4. Sign block in at least 3/4-1" lettering in middle of center square with permanent fabric pen or embroidery. Include this line under your name: Member Since fill in year you joined QGOA!

Hanging Corners - Corner Triangles for Hanging a Small Quilt

- 1. Cut two 3" squares of your backing or binding material.
- 2. Fold in half diagonally. Press.
- 3. Align the folded triangles on the back of the quilt to the TOP right and left corners, raw edges even. Pin. Double check you placed the corners on the top corners!
- 4. Sew on the binding in your usual method.

Blocks will be retained by the QGOA for future exhibits.


Block Party

Bow Tie (4-1/2" unfinished)

September 2016

Please note that this is the September block. I have not yet had the chance to rework the instructions for the August block, so we will skip ahead. Thank you for your patience.

Make 4 blocks. Directions are for 1 block.



Fabric 1 (light): Cut two 2-1/2" squares

Fabric 2 (dark): Cut two 2-1/2" squares

Cut 2 1-1/2" squares

Draw a diagonal line on the back of the smaller fabric 2 squares. Place right sides together with a fabric one square. Stitch along the diagonal line, press open and trim excess.

Assemble following diagram.

Mystery Round Robin

For the next border round, make a border with the pieced block or blocks of your choice. Ideas include log cabins, sawtooth stars, or a keyboard border.

A keyboard border is strips in the length and width of your choosing. The strips can be the same color, or they can be different colors.

President's Block

To show appreciation for our past president's, guild members make a block of the president's choosing to give to her. Barbara Cain, our president in 2015, has decided on a Bow-Tie Block, in shades of blue or gray on a white or white on white background. These blocks will be going into a quilt for a boy, so please use fabrics that are not overly feminine. The block should measure 6-1/2" unfinished.

Directions are below:

White Fabric

Cut two 3-1/2" squares

Blue / Gray Fabric

- Cut two 3-1/2" squares
- Cut two 2" squares

Sewing Instructions

- Draw a diagonal line on the back of the 2" squares
- Place the 2" squares right sides together with the white squares, matching one corner.



• Stitch along the diagonal line, and fold back, matching corners. Trim seam allowance to ¼". Make 2.



Assemble your squares to make block.

If you have been hiding under a rock for the past few years and don't know what the Row by Row Experience is all about, I am about to to tell you.

Row by Row Experience™ began in 2011 with 20 quilt shops across New York State. In 2012 the event grew to include 62 participating shops. Pennsylvania came on board in 2013 for a total of 138 shops throughout the two states.
