QUILT SHOW

A motion was presented to the QGOA Executive Board and will be presented to the General Membership with the following information. The topic has been presented, with Q&A, at the last two guild meetings.

1. To work with the collaboration of North Texas quilt guilds and the Original Sewing and Quilts Expo, F+W, Inc. to plan, promote and execute a quilt display/show at the Arlington, Texas Convention Center in August 2017. The event will be called: **North Texas Quilt Festival and the Original Sewing and Quilts Expo.** To engage in this event with the good faith and understanding that QGOA and the collaboration of North Texas quilt guilds will work together in a similar event annually defined as: coupling a Quilt Festival and financially beneficial feature events with a larger-format public event.

Each party shall inform the other within forty-five (45) days after the event whether they have no interest in repeating the event (or a similar event) the following year.

- 2. To not to hold the Annual QGOA Quilt Festival in April 2017. It would not be feasible to hold two quilt shows in the same year. If the above partnership does not continue to be acceptable to QGOA then we could and would consider holding the Quilt Festival again.
- 3. Participating guilds may be: Bear Creek Quilt Guild, Fort Worth Quilt Guild, Fort Worth Modern Quilt Guild, Irving Quilt Guild, Quilters' Guild of Arlington and Trinity Valley Quilt Guild.
- 4. This advisement will be presented to the QGOA Executive Board at the August 2 meeting and then the August 9 general guild meeting. The agreement of both parties will be necessary for QGOA participation in the North Texas Quilt Festival and Original Sewing and Quilts Expo.

Additional Information:

1. Revenue from the North Texas Quilt Festival will come from presale of entry tickets. F+W will give each participating guild complimentary tickets, plus half cost tickets that can be sold by members and area quilt shops. Also there may be a preview night of the quilt show with a 'celebrity' speaker.

Also each guild would have a guild booth where we may display our Donation Quilt, SGK silent auction, sell guild products and donated guilts.

- 2. The collaboration of North Texas Quilt Guilds and the Original Sewing and Quilts Expo, F+W, Inc. will each draft an agreement that the president of guild will need to sign for intent to participate in the event. It has been requested to have this commitment finalized by the <u>beginning of September</u>.
- 3. F+W, Inc. will provide the facility, insurance, arrange vendors, speakers/teachers, publicity, judges, ribbons and awards, poles & drapes, online registration, online quilt entry and collection of fees.
- 4. The participating guilds will <u>each</u> be responsible for: appointing one leader and assistant that will be able to work with the collaboration of the guilds, assist and organize a committee for the collaborations, setting guidelines for the Divisions and Categories for show entries, develop a formula to determine fair participation in number of quilt entries and volunteers from each guild to check in and out quilt entries, layout, hang the quilt entries, to help with set up/take down and running the quilt festival, and arranging and organizing each representative booth.
- 5. There are no anticipated expenses for QGOA participating with the collaboration of North Texas Quilt Guilds and the Original Sewing and Quilts Expo, F+W, Inc.
- 6. Quilt entries for each guild will be determined by their total of membership on the first of the month before the end of the guild's calendar year. QGOA calendar year is Jan Dec. so our total membership number will be total of members for 2016 membership, as of Dec. 1, 2016.

That number will also determine the number of volunteers our guild will be expected to provide in the above responsibilities.

- 7. Fees and registration for quilt entries will be arranged by F+W. It is anticipated that the cost of a quilt entry will be \$25. It will cover the cost of professional fire retardant drapes & poles, judges and ribbons.
- 8. There will be a limit of quilt entries per guild. The number will be determined by the committee and based upon the membership of each guild. There will also be a limit per guild member for quilt entries.
- 9. There was a motion proposed to the QGOA Executive Board that we cancel our April 2017 quilt show and participate in the August 2017 North Texas Quilt Show and bring this for a vote to the general membership on the August 9, 2016 general meeting. This motion was unanimously passed by the Executive Board. On August 9, 2016 there will be a vote of the general membership to participate in the North Texas Quilt Show at the Arlington Convention Center.

Special thanks to Jolene Mershon, Sandy Hughes, Ching-Ling Herbert, Nancy Shortino, Janice Farris, Randa Dillon, Pam Hall, Gayle LaCerda, Happy Johns, and a little turtle told me that there is fabric waiting for me to retrieve at Janice and David Mowery's house, and forgive me if I missed your acknowledgement.

Linus received kits from the kit fairy, crochet blanket, fleece blankets, quilts, quilt tops and baby hats. Project Linus meets the 2nd and 4th Thursdays of the month, but always check to verify, just in case there is a conflict at the church. We meet at 4100 SW Loop 820, Fort Worth. We meet from 9-3ish, this is SouthCliff Baptist Church.

We bring our own machines, our notions, and any project that we prefer or we sew quilt sandwiches and attach labels to the donated quilts. Quilters' Guild of Arlington Celebration Block







Makes One Twelve Inch Finished Block

Please review all instructions before making the block. Must be a light star in dark/medium background, block may be no larger than 12.5".

Need: 1. FABRIC A - 4.5" x 36" - MEDIUM TO DARK 2. FABRIC B - 2.5" x 20", plus 4.5" square - LIGHT that is suitable for name to be seen, no strong prints; 200 ct. muslin or plain fabric is suggested. 3. Batting - 13" square 4. 13-14" square backing fabric 5. Binding fabric - two 40 - 42" widths of fabric; cut 2.5" strips, miter for one strip, double fold

Cutting Instructions

*If you are going to heavily quilt, embellish or appliqué the block you may want to cut the pieces 4.5"x 5", then square up block to 12.5". Be careful to put star points on 4.5" side.

Cut 8* - 4.5" squares of medium to dark fabric - FABRIC A If using a fat quarter, cut along short side (18") must be at least 18"; two strips of 4.5". This will allow for 13" square for backing.

Cut 1* - 4.5" square light fabric - FABRIC B You may wish to embroider your name and "Member Since" line before constructing the block

Cut 8 - 2.5" squares of same light fabric - FABRIC B

Cut 1 -13-14 " square of backing fabric, may be same as A or different

Cut two 3" squares of either your backing or binding material, for "hanging corners"

Cut 1 - 13 " square batting

Cut two (2) widths of fabric (40-42") cut 2.5" strips for binding.

Assembling Block - sew all seams with 1/4" accurate seam width

- 1. The star points are made using the stitch and flip method: Place a 2.5" sq. of fabric B in the corner of A with the right sides of the fabrics facing each other. With a pencil and ruler, mark a diagonal line on B from the corner to corner as shown. Sew on the line.
- 2. Trim patch 1/4" from sewn line. Press it gently to corner.
- Repeat with another B patch on adjacent corner to create star points. Make total of 4 matching units for each of the star point units.
- 4. Join the matching units into rows with A patches as shown above; press the seams allowances toward the A"s; middle row to B patch. Sew the rows together to complete the star block. Finish
- 1. Quilt the block. You may embellish and quilt as desired to personalize your block! It cannot be larger than 12.5" square, so do nothing to extend size or 'dangle' off block.
- 2. Please make two "hanging corners", see below for instructions.
- Sew on the binding to the block.
- 4. Sign block in at least 3/4-1" lettering in middle of center square with permanent fabric pen or embroidery. Include this line under your name: Member Since fill in year you joined QGOA!

Hanging Corners - Corner Triangles for Hanging a Small Quilt

- 1. Cut two 3" squares of your backing or binding material.
- 2. Fold in half diagonally. Press.
- 3. Align the folded triangles on the back of the quilt to the TOP right and left corners, raw edges even. Pin. Double check you placed the corners on the top corners!
- 4. Sew on the binding in your usual method.

Blocks will be retained by the QGOA for future exhibits.


Block Party

Rail Fence (12-1/2" unfinished)

I have still not had the opportunity to rework the instructions for the August block. Please bear with me, but I hope to have it for next month.

Make 1 block.



Fabric 1: Cut four 2 x 6-1/2" strips

Fabric 2: Cut four 2 x 6-1/2" strips

Fabric 3: Cut four 2 x 6-1/2" strips

Fabric 4: Cut four 2 x 6-1/2" strips

Make each block by sewing one of each color strips together. Make each block the same, sewing strips together in the same order.

President's Block

To show appreciation for our past president's, guild members make a block of the president's choosing to give to her. Barbara Cain, our president in 2015, has decided on a Bow-Tie Block, in shades of blue or gray on a white or white on white background. These blocks will be going into a quilt for a boy, so please use fabrics that are not overly feminine. The block should measure 6-1/2" unfinished.

Directions are below:

White Fabric

Cut two 3-1/2" squares

Blue / Gray Fabric

- Cut two 3-1/2" squares
- Cut two 2" squares

Sewing Instructions

- Draw a diagonal line on the back of the 2" squares
- Place the 2" squares right sides together with the white squares, matching one corner.



• Stitch along the diagonal line, and fold back, matching corners. Trim seam allowance to ¼". Make 2.



Assemble your squares to make block.

When planning a quilt, make a combination information/ swatch sheet for the quilt. Here is some of the things you may want to include:

- Swatches of each fabric to be used in the quilt top
- · Swatches of backing, binding, and BATTING
- · Amount of each fabric needed
- · Name of fabric line of each fabric
- Color name and reference number for each fabric used in pattern
- Where fabric was purchased
