July Meeting – Judy Steward-Machine Quilting

Judy is a quilt artist who also loves to teach others about quilting and making their dream a reality. She has been teaching quilting classes since the md 1990's. She teaches both traditional and art quilt techniques in her classes.

During the lecture she will show quilts that have been machine quilted. There are a variety of designs from traditional to art fillers. She demonstrates how I machine quilt on my home sewing machine. One of her favorite parts of the demo is how to get a large quilt under the machine and work with it.

Today she creates designs with machine quilting that goes far beyond what my grandmother could imagine. Thread, designs, texture and color all mix to bring my art to life.

August Meeting – Lynn Roddy Brown

LYNN RODDY BROWN is a sixth generation Texan who has always loved to sew. In the early 1970s, she began tearing pictures of quilts from magazines and did some patchwork with templates, but it was not until 1989 when she lived in Rochester, New York, that she began to quilt seriously.

For the past nine years, she has been a member of a bee that trades blocks for scrap quilts. She loves scrap quilts because it gives her the opportunity to use many different fabrics. She has had three of her quilts hug in the IQA juried show in Houston, two of which were scrap quilts.

Lynn currently lives in Houston, Texas, with her husband, an economics professor at Rice University. They have three mostly grown children (Kim, Wes, and Nancy), one wonderful son-in-law (Craig), and two cherished grandchildren (Lillian and Eli). Lynn has been a seventh-grade science teacher and computer programmer. She received a kidney transplant in January of 2002, for which she is truly grateful. Some of her other hobbies include genealogy and Western swing dancing with her husband.

Sharon Ligon

Sharon has selected a spool block for this year. There are 2 options for making it—it can be a single color for the thread/main part of the block, or you can use some of your strips to create a strip-pieced thread section.

Cutting:

Light Tan/Off White: Cut four (4) 1-1/2" squares

Cut two (2) 1-1/2" x 4-1/2" strips

Brown: Cut two (2) 1-1/2" x 5-1/2" strip

Single Color: Cut one (1) 3-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangle

If doing multiple color, cut 4 fabrics into 1-1/2" x 4" strips

- 1. Draw a diagonal line on the back of each of the $1 \cdot 1/2$ " squares.
- 2. Place a square on each end of the brown strip, as shown.





3. Stitch on the diagonal line. Repeat with the other brown strip and off white squares. Press the squares open and trim.

4. If making a strip set, sew your strips together using a scant $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam along the long sides. Trim down to a 3-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangle.



5. Stitch the tan background strips to the long side of the strip set or your solid rectangle. Add the top and bottom strips.



We deliver about 300 quilts each month to the different hospitals and other child advocacy facilities in our area. So thank each and every one of you for your talent and energy that you so graciously give to help children suffering from illness and disease.

Project Linus is happy to accept any of your unwanted items for sewing and quilt making. So when you are doing some rearranging please keep these kids in mind and bring your contributions to the meeting and I will happily take them to repurpose them. All items such as: batting, fabric, thread, needles, pins, assembled blocks, tops, backing, fat quarters, or any useful sewing needs.

Special thanks this month to: DEBRA WARE, JUDY LISTON, ROBBIE COLLEY, JANICE FARRIS, TORY SHWARTZWELDER, MARY LOPES, LINDA MCPHERSON, DOTTIE HUGHES, SANDY HUGHES, JOLENE MERSHON, ELIZABETH CARR, JANICE AND DAVID MOWERY, DEBBIE WOLF and Anonymous.

We meet the second and fourth Thursdays of the month at 4100 SW Loop 820 at Southcliff Baptist Church. We meet from 9-ish til 2-ish. We bring our own machines, notions, any work that we want to do, we sew together quilt sandwiches that are then tied. We bring our lunches and there is a drink and/or snack machine available. We eat at our seats and have show and tell. There are also tables that are used to assemble the 3 pieces to make the quilt sandwiches.

The hospitals request certain sizes to attempt to accommodate all their patients.

40 x 44 for the smaller tots

57 x 44 for the bigger kids

Also keep in mind that in the fall Linus distributes quilts to Snowball Express. This is an organization that is for children of a deceased active military member. These are suggested to be some of the larger sizes because these kids are flown to Dallas to have a weekend of much needed attention and entertainment. They like all the things other kids like, game characters or movie characters, and also Army, Navy, Marine, Air Force themed fabric. The only thing they ask not to receive is anything that is a flag or representative of an American flag. The fear is that a reminder of the presentation of the flag for their loss might upset an otherwise wonderful time. Please take this in the spirit it is given. Thanks for your help with this honorable effort.
