Gyleen Fitzgerald makes quilts that blend color, pattern, and texture to

provide a contemporary essence in traditional quilting. Her strength as a quilter is demonstrated by the infusion of engineering tools and innovative techniques to simplify visually complex quilts. She shares her enthusiasm for quilting through interactive lectures and workshops. As a writer, Gyleen centers on haiku poetry, quilt project books, magazine articles and children’s books. An avid quilter, Gyleen has earned Best of Show honors and as a publisher, she is a Gold Medal winner for Quilts: Unfinished Stories with New Endings. She is best known for inspiring Trash to Treasure Pineapple Quilts and the creation of the Pineapple Tool by Gyleen.

Gyleen has appeared on The Quilt Show and Lifetime TV promoting a contemporary spirit in traditional quiltmaking.

For Gyleen, dreams hold no limits. Ray, her husband, is her shining light and quilting is her passion; together they color her world in a very special way.

Gyleen is a Philadelphia, PA native, who spent her formative years in Taiwan and Japan.

**“Make Mine with Scraps” Workshop
Wednesday July 11**

Fabric Requirements:

- 1 1/2” strips cut from scraps
- 1 1/4 yard of solid or semi-solid fabric, cut 3 to 4 strips 1 1/2” by width of fabric
- 1 1/4 yard or more fabric that you believe is stunning for the border and center squares

Homework:

Cut down all the scraps that you gathered to 1 1/2” strips. Grain or length doesn’t matter, just make sure you have a large variety. The shortest piece needed is 2” and the longest is 6”. You’re going to need lots of strips.

Do not precut to length.

Cut 4 or so 1 1/2” strips of your solid or semi-solid. Bring the rest to class.

Special Tools:

Gyleen’s Pineapple Tool
Instructions: Book—Trash to Treasures Pineapples

General Supplies:

- Sewing machine with manual
- ¼” foot without edge guide if possible
- 2 thread colors, one for the top and another in the bobbin that is visible on the wrong side of fabric
- seam ripper
- thread snips
- extension cord
- batting to use as a design wall (optional)
- huge bag or basket that stays open for your strips
- finger pressing tool
- rotary cutter, ruler, mat
- straight pins

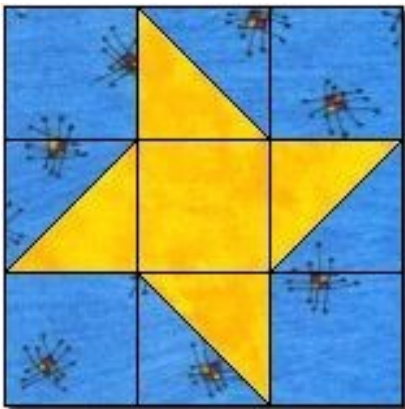

Congratulation to the Quilters' Guild of Arlington for another very successful Quilt Festival!

In collaboration with the other 5 North Texas quilt guilds and the Original Sewing and Quilt Expo the event at the Arlington Convention center was enjoyed by many!

Many thanks to all our fantastic members that volunteered their time and talents. Special thanks to Jenn Haxton, Rhonda Weddle and Cynthia Berend for representing our guild's interests in the organizing of the festival. Our guild booth was quite a success by efforts of Susan FitzGerald and all those that stitched, sewed and assembled items for sale. Kudos to Jill Matyastik for designing our booth! Cynthia also handled the ticket sales for the admission, Festival Night and our wonderful local quilt shops (lots of organizing!!). We are very fortunate that Jenn has volunteered to coordinate the NTQF next year! Kathy Sisney, our talented treasurer, tabulated, deposited, and taught many to use the Square system to accept credit card payments for sales of items at the show. Thanks also to Linda McPherson for arranging the sale of the show Tshirt and selling them during the event! As with all things, change is inevitable, and our show again may experience some changes next year. The Arlington Convention Center will be remodeled soon and may not have the space to hold the event. If so, the NTQF and Expo will move to another convention site for 2019. OSQE will make that determination soon and the location and date will be announced. But, **it will be held**, either in August or September, location TBD! So keep designing and making your amazing and wonderful quilts!

Information about this year's show:

Attendance was down considerably from last year: Thursday: 1290; Friday 1349; Saturday 1066; Total, 3705. (In 2017: Thursday: 1505; Friday 1680; Saturday 1733; Total 5548). Possibly the time of year, vacations, end of the school year?



Guild Proceeds

The guild did very well in money earned for our guild! Sale of Crafts, Tshirts, Tote Bags, Quilts for sale, Miniature quilts = \$2,432 Ticket sales: admission and Festival Night = \$2,145

QGOA Proceeds for tickets sold at area quilt shops plus bag check income = \$677

Expenses of show (printing & supplies) & Festival Night= \$523

2018 NET FOR QGOA \$4,740

Net Income for 2017 was \$ 4,038

In addition Cancer Care also will receive for sale of miniature quilts= \$460

Additional money was also earned by the sale of donation tickets for our beautiful guild quilt and new membership fees!

Congratulations to all the award winners in the Festival and everyone that entered a quilt. Each of you represented our guild well and it was wonderful that you shared your talents with all the visitors to the festival! Hope you had an opportunity to hear Marianne Fons speak at Festival Night. She gave a great talk about styles of quilts, trends in quilting and gave definitions to categories of quilt designs. It was exciting to have such a legend in the quilting world speak at our event!

I have appreciated the support by our board and guild members in initiating this collaboration and quilt festival. Jenn will do a great job as the next coordinator and know all of you will strive to support her and our guild for the next North Texas Quilt Festival!

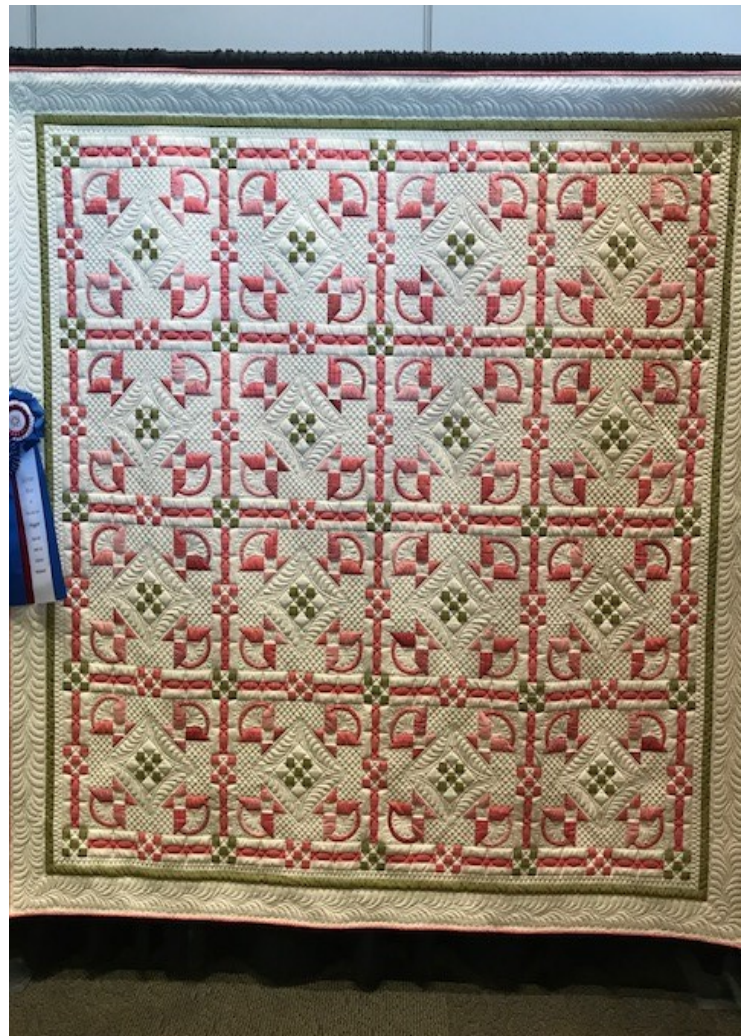

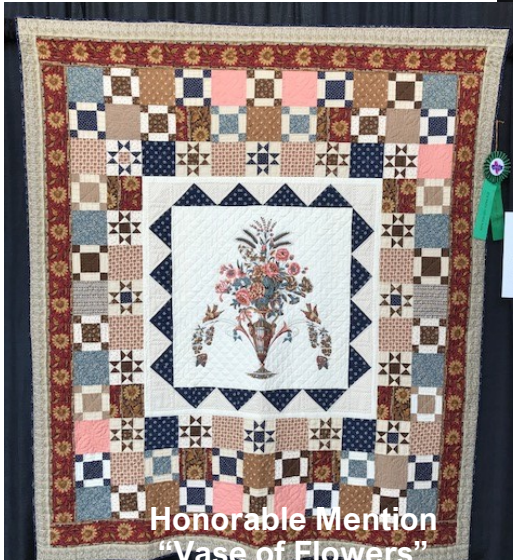

Ronald McDonald Challenge Fabric Quilt Guidelines

1. This challenge fabric is donated by Quilt Among Friends. Please take opportunities to thank them for their sponsorship.
2. Packet containing the challenge fabric is \$5. The quilt maker who uses this fabric and turns the quilt in at the in May 2019 guild meeting will receive a \$5 gift card from Quilt Among Friends.
3. Quilts must use a recognizable amount of the challenge fabric in the quilt.
4. Maker may use any other coordinating fabrics.

5. The quilt must be washable and have no buttons or similar items attached that could be accidentally swallowed by young children.



6. Finished quilts must be at least 50 inches on each side.
7. ****Quilts must have an entry form and turned in at the 2019 May guild meeting. You do not need to add a sleeve.
8. Entries will be displayed at the June 2019 guild meeting and members will vote on them for ribbons.

Ronald McDonald House **Non-Challenge Fabric** Quilt

1. To be donated to Ronald McDonald House: any fabric may be used, quilts will be at least 50 in on each side, must be washable and have no buttons or similar items attached that could be accidentally swallowed by young children. These are due in May 2019.
2. ****Quilts must have an entry form and turned in at the May guild meeting. You do not need to add a sleeve.
3. Entries will be displayed at the June guild meeting and members will vote on them for ribbons.

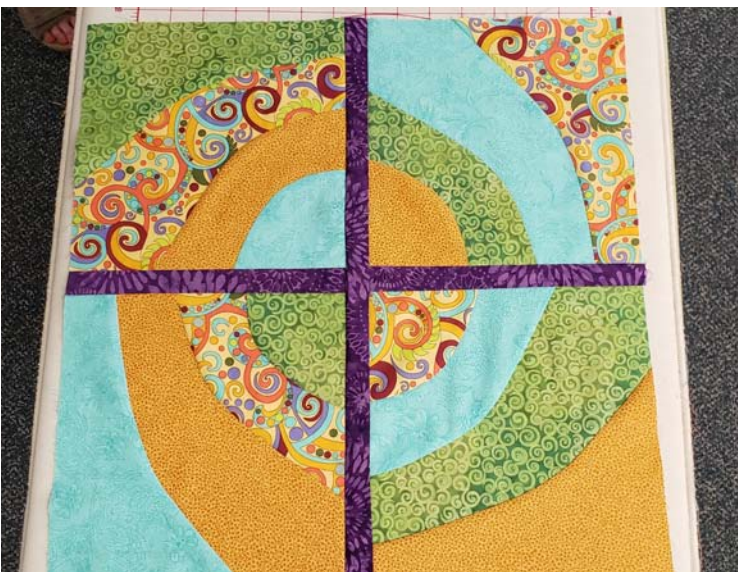
