Our February Speaker and Workshop Presenter!

Susan Corbett is one of our favorite custom machine quilters. Why custom? Beauty and craftsmanship. She love the way excellent machine quilting can take your breath away. Edge-to-edge quilting doesn't do that. Quilting is supposed to enhance a quilt, not just hold it together. She sees machine quilting as an art form. Susan's discovery of quilt making in 1995 coincided with the publication of the fourth edition of Harriett Hargrave's Heirloom Machine Quilting book, with which she became obsessed. When she saw her first longer, she fell in love! She trained with Linda Taylor and Hari Walner and set out to quilt full time. One of Susan's strengths is a knack for coming up with a design scheme. Although she does not have an "art" degree, her quilts have won 8 best-of-show wards at various North Texas Quilt shows. She is also a supporter of local guild groups and loves talking quilting! Susan's motto is Eat, Sleep, Quilt.

NEEDED

Miniature Quilts for auction at our quilt show!!!

We have two miniature quilt categories for the show. The first called the "**Pink Challenge**" was started years ago in memory of a former member (Nancy Martinson) who passed away from breast cancer. The hope was that all proceeds of these quilts would go to Cancer. The size must not exceed 24" on any one side, 75% of the quilt must be PINK, blocks cannot be larger than 3" finished with a minimum of 9 blocks. The Pink Challenge quilts are due at the June guild meeting.

The second miniature quilt challenge can be of any color combination. It cannot exceed 24" on any one side, must have a minimum of 9 blocks unless it is a whole cloth or medallion style quilt and the blocks must not exceed 4" finished. These miniatures will be due at the July guild meeting.

Please be sure to go online and fill out the form for each miniature for submission to the show. When completing the application, you will have a choice of whether you want proceeds of the sale to go to Cancer Care Services or to QGOA.

I challenge every member to make at least ONE miniature quilt. Please contact me for any assistance you may need.

Time is flying by quickly. The quilts are due at the May guild meeting or before. Each quilt submitted must have an entry form (included below). The guild members will be voting on these at the June potluck meeting.

The guidelines:

Ronald McDonald Challenge Fabric Quilt Guidelines

1. This challenge fabric is donated by Quilt Among Friends. Please take opportunities to thank them for their sponsorship.
2. Packet containing the challenge fabric is \$5. The quilt maker who uses this fabric and turns the quilt in at the in *May 2019 guild meeting* will receive a \$5 gift card from Quilt Among Friends.
3. Quilts must use a recognizable amount of the challenge fabric in the quilt.
4. Maker may use any other coordinating fabrics.
5. The quilt must be washable and have no buttons or similar items attached that could be accidentally swallowed by young children.
6. Finished quilts must be at least 50 inches on each side.
7. ****Quilts must have an entry form and turned in at the May guild meeting. You do not need to add a sleeve.
8. Entries will be displayed at the June guild meeting and members will vote on them for ribbons.

Ronald McDonald House (non-challenge fabric) Quilt

1. To be donated to Ronald McDonald House: any fabric may be used, quilts will be at least 50 in on each side, must be washable and have no buttons or similar items attached that could be accidentally swallowed by young children. *These are due in May 2019.*
2. ****Quilts must have an entry form and turned in at the May guild meeting. You do not need to add a sleeve
3. Entries will be displayed at the June guild meeting and members will vote on them for ribbons.
