Shop My Stash gift cards were received by Robbie Colley, Joyce Clark, Tory Swartzwelder, Susan Corbet and Barbara Garner. If you shopped and didn't finish your quilt, please finish and turn in for next year, think of it as a head start for 2020.

I have received 37 quilts and 2 fleece blankets. Thank you to all of those who completed and turned in quilts thru the year.

This surpasses our goal of 22 quilts in recognition of the 22 Veterans who lose their battle to suicide each day.

Our quilts will be distributed to military veterans and active duty service personnel thru the Semper Fi Fund (services all branches) who will put them in the hands of case workers to be personally given to those who serve or have served.



Ladies and Gentlemen: We're entering the holiday season. Hopefully you still have some time to quilt. Project Linus meets the 2nd Thursday of the month at Westminster Presbyterian Church on Trail Lake in Fort Worth. We gather in the fellowship hall and prepare quilt tops, sandwich tops backs and batting, sew those sandwiches together, crochet fleece blankets and whole blankets, sew tops together, nibble on goodies from our participants, chatter, and share ideas. We arrive no earlier than 9:30 (there is a child care there and we don't intrude on their delivery) and we remain till about 2:30 or whenever you can spare time.

This month Project Linus would like to specially thank lots of our guild members who donate their time and energy to support the children in treatment at our local hospitals. Those locations include John Peter Smith, Harris, Cook Children's and their satellite locations, Safe Haven, CASA(a child advocacy group), Catholic charities. Linus also donates to police stations when requested for children received from Child protective services. Your efforts reach so many children that need a blanket to comfort them in whatever serious situation they find themselves. Please know that you are appreciated.

SO to the current thanks: Veronica Mowery, Jolene Mershon (the kit fairy), Billie Breechen and Judy Liston, Robbie Colley, Charlotte Humphrey, Janice Farris, Janice Mowery (the fleece and flannel fairy), Debra Hood, Jana McBroom, Nancy Spell (Polka Dot Princess), Sherry Livingston, Jill Matyastik, Maria Freitag and anonymous. Thanks to all of you and if I missed your name, please forgive me. It does help if you attach your name to your donation. Please know that your kindness helps so many children and their families that are so courageous in their personal battles.

As a reminder the hospitals ask for small quilts measure 44 X 40

For larger kiddos please try to make them 57 X 44. there are lots of big kids there also.

If you have a notion to straighten or discard some items for qu9iltiing please remember Project Linus tries to use all donated items. You can donate fabric, fleece, flannel, notions, batting, blocks, thread, yarn, or any item that can be used to create these gifts for our local kids.


2020 Ronald McDonald House (RMH) Quilts Challenge

In 2020 there are two types of Ronald McDonald House Quilts Challenges:

Ronald McDonald House Challenge Fabric Quilt Guidelines

This challenge fabric is donated by Quilt Among Friends. Please take opportunities to thank them for their sponsorship.

Packet containing the challenge fabric is \$5. The quilt maker who uses this fabric and turns the quilt in at the in May 2020 guild meeting will receive a \$5 gift card from Quilt Among Friends.



Maker may use any other coordinating fabrics.

The quilt must be washable and have no buttons or similar items attached that could be accidentally swallowed by young children.

Finished quilts must be at least 50 inches on each side.

****Quilts must have an entry form and turned in at the May guild meeting. You do not need to add a sleeve.

Entries will be displayed at the June guild meeting and members will vote on them for ribbons.

Ronald McDonald House (non-challenge fabric) Quilt Guidelines

To be donated to Ronald McDonald House any fabric may be used.

The quilt must be washable and have no buttons or similar items attached that could be accidentally swallowed by young children.

Finished quilts must be at least 50 inches on each side.

****Quilts must have an entry form and turned in at the May guild meeting. You do not need to add a sleeve.

Entries will be displayed at the June guild meeting and members will vote on them for ribbons.
