Dear ones, Project Linus is working hard to care for the Tarrant county children in treatment and need. And isn't this year just whizzing by? Linus meets the second Thursday of each month at Westminster Presbyterian church in the fellowship Hall. We meet from 9:30-2:00ish. We gather and take our machines for the ones sewing quilt sandwiches, labels or quilt tops. There are also crocheters and knitters. There are those that tie the prepared quilts and two tables that build the three layers of quilts to be sewn.

We take our lunches and there are always snacks. We also take non-perishable goods for the church's community outreach. Linus delivers about 350 quilts per month to area facilities. We have show and tell and sew and chat and sew and chat!

The hospitals request several sizes: for smaller tots 44 x 44 and for the larger kiddos 57 x 44 or anything larger. We have kits from our "Kit Fairy" that one may take home and piece, layer and quilt. Please feel free to ask me for those items.

# **2020 Miniature Auction Requirements**

# Cancer Challenge Miniatures due at May Guild Meeting/Voting in June



### Non-Cancer Challenge Miniatures are due in July

Miniatures may be submitted for Nancy's Cancer Challenge or for Non-Challenge. No entry fee is required. All entries must be Show quality. Proceeds may be designated by maker for QGOA or for Cancer Care Services. The former "Nancy's Pink Challenge" is being updated to "Nancy's Cancer Challenge" to allow broader expression of honoring loved ones with any type cancer. See chart below for the recognized associated colors.

#### **General Rules:**

- Must be no larger than 24" on any side
- Must have a two-Inch sleeve on the back (sleeves only; no tabs)
- May not be made with a panel: will not qualify
- Must have label with name of maker & credit given to pattern maker if pattern is used.
- Must contain at least 9 blocks, each block no larger than 4" finished


Some minis will be sold in the auction and others sold in guild booth

### Nancy's Cancer Challenge:

- Must follow the general rules above
- Must be no larger than 24" on any side
- \* Must be constructed with 75% of the color associated with type of cancer represented
- Must have label that includes the type cancer being represented

Non-Challenge Quilts: May be a modern design, traditional, art, whole cloth or medallion (pieced or appliqued), conforming to general rules

above.



# Spool Block

Here is the pattern for the spool block.

The color of thread can be any color they wish but the white color should be white or white on white.

#### Unfinished block size of 6.5".

Number of Fabrics: 2

Number of Pieces: 7


The finished Spool Block should measure

6 1/2" square





- (2) 3" squares
- (2) 2 1/2" squares
- (2) 3" squares
- (1) 2 1/2" x 6 1/2 rectangle



# **Piecing**

make (4) 2 1/2" HSTs using the 3" squares.

Using a 1/4" seam allowance, sew (2) HSTs to either side of a 2 1/2" square. Press away from the HSTs.

Row should measure 3 1/2" x 6 1/2". Repeat to make (2).

Using a 1/4" seam allowance, sew rows and 2 1/2" x 6 1/2" rectangle together. Press seams toward the center of the block.
