January 2021 Speaker Leo Ransom!

Leo took Home Ec in high school, found himself to be a natural with a sewing machine, and learned to piece guilts. In college, he couldn't afford fabric, so he didn't quilt again until 1998, when he made a guilt to auction at his family reunion. He started watching episodes of Simply Quilts with Alex Anderson to learn more, but became bored with traditional quilting. He attended a guild workshop that taught portraiture quilting, took a couple more classes, and the rest is history. He is now a Master Art Quilter and teaches at quilt shops around the Metroplex and surrounding areas. His lecture will include a trunk show of some of his award-winning portraiture quilts. Please use Christmas fabric to make your house block. Dimension are listed below:

Block is 6" x 4.5" unfinished

Sides - 2" x 3"

Top – 1.5" x 4.5"

Door - 1.5" x 3"

Roof – 2.5" x 4.5" (corners for snowballing 2.5" x 2.5")


This is such a fun pattern. During this long winter's break, let's all start making some tiny houses.

### Size Requirements: $55 \times 65$ to $72 \times 90$ , ideal size $55 \times 65$


If you have made a top and are unable to quilt it, we have a few wonderful longarm quilters that will help with a few.
