







I would like to close each month with a portion of a poem called

Quilt Show Booth

It's time to start making items for the guild to sell at our booth this summer's quilt show. Funds go to support our guild's budgeting needs.

We want your hand crafted items that quilters and sewers might find useful, practical, frivolous, pretty, etc. We'd like to have several of an item versus only one of an item. And yes, one-of-akind items are desirable as well. Pin cushions, scarves, hot pads, bags, table runners, novelty items, etc. work great. Quilts are typically more expensive than customers want to spend. So, quilts aren't a good merchandise choice.

We're aiming to organize items around the various holidays. So, use holiday fabrics as you create your wonderful items. Items can be crafted from wood, yarn, and other materials as well as fabric.

We will begin collecting items at the February Guild Meeting and collect through July. Look for a basket tables at the entrance. If you have any questions, please contact Lea Bailey (see directory).

Quilt Booth Sewing Group

There is a group of about 12 people that meet monthly to work on items for the guild's booth. It's like a sewing bee. We focus on various items each month sewing multiples, or you can sew on what you want to make. It's fun to work together sewing on these items. We meet at Holy Cross Lutheran Church, 4400 W. Announcing the Monthly Miniature Challenge!

As you all know, our goal is to make money for both our Guild and the charity that our members choose to support each year. We need to make miniatures that people want to purchase.

After several years of working with the minis at the quilt show, I've learned that themed minis sell the quickest and for the most money.

Each month we will announce a new theme. However you are always welcome to create what you love to make. Minis will be displayed at our meetings and voted on by attending members. First, second and third place ribbons will be given. While displayed, a silent auction form will be with the mini. The minimum prices will be set by the quilt maker. If the minimum amount is met, the quilt will be sold to the highest bidder at the meeting. I believe our members should have first choice of these outstanding miniature quilts. All quilts that are not purchased at our meetings, will be collected, stored, and entered into the quilt show for auction.

February – Valentines and sweethearts

March – Party Hardy! – St Patrick's Day

April – Spring

May and June - Guys and Dolls/Father's and

Mother's Day

July – Patriotic

August - Summer

September – Back to School

October – Halloween

November – Fall

December – Christmas and Hanukah

Always – Quilts geared to men, and any holiday

Minimum requirements: Quilts must be no larger than 24 inches on any side. Quilts must have a hanging sleeve. I will provide the forms to fill out at the meetings. I will enter the quilts for the quilt show.

These charities are listed in alphabetical order.

1 – Arlington Urban Ministries AUM was started in 2001 as a faith-based organization that provides emergency assistance for utilities, rent and food for those in crisis in the Arlington community. AUM will empower clients by providing support, education and resources to improve their long-term financial stability. AUM is funded by donations and Nu2U resale shop. 2 - Christian Women's Job Corps Founded in 1995, Christian Women's Job Corps, provides job skills, social skills and helps build self-esteem in women needing a second chance. Locally, CWJC's training program is enhanced by women who serve as mentors and commit to a one-on-one relationship with a participant until she reaches a level of independence and acceptance in the job marketplace. Funded via donations.

3 – Open Arms Health Clinic
Open Arms mission is to provide free,
quality, compassionate healthcare to
individuals and families of North Texas
dealing with chronic and non-emergency
acute illnesses, who have barriers to
accessing healthcare. By promoting wellness
and providing physical, emotional, and
spiritual care in a loving, nurturing
environment. The faith-based nonprofit clinic
is staffed by volunteer professionals and
100% funded by grants and donations.
