November 8 Guest Speaker KATIE LEWIS

Scrappy Applique

Katie Lewis is a quilter and teacher. She is passionate about helping quilters to explore their

creativity through fabric and sewing. She will be providing a program and workshop on Scrappy Appliqué, a raw-edge appliqué technique developed by quilter and author Shannon Brinkley. Scrappy Appliqué is fun and easy, freeing quilters to play with fabric and color to create unique quilt mosaics. Perfect for beginners and advanced quilters alike, Scrappy Appliqué is also an excellent scrap-buster!

During the program participants will be inspired to play with color and fabric during this interactive program and trunk show. Learn about this Scrappy Appliqué method and be inspired to use these techniques in your own projects. Katie will provide lots of examples using her own quilts. We'll discuss fabric selection, the Scrappy Appliqué technique, and finishing options.

November 9 WORKSHOP Scrappy Applique

The Scrappy Appliqué workshop is perfect for both beginner and advanced quilters. It is so much fun because it takes the pressure off piecing perfectly and allows us to explore color and pattern in a fun and easy way. The templates give just enough direction to give students confidence in their finished quilt, but the freedom to create a quilt that is as unique as they are. It's perfect for brand new quilters and experienced guilters wanting to think outside the box. Participants will learn how to take fabric scraps and turn them into gorgeous appliqué pieces. Participants choose their favorite pattern (available for purchase at the workshop) and learn the Scrappy Appliqué technique step-by-step. Trust me, you'll see appliqué in a whole new way.

Please take time to recognize one of your worthy fellow guild members for the **Golden Spool Award**.



Free Tutorial - Card Basket Quilt Block Where the pattern states, Dottie would like...

- Light/Ivory; Use White or a white on white
- Medium/Green; Use Light Blue in a calico, print or batik
- ◆ Dark 1/Burgundy Calico; Use Medium Blue in a calico, print or batik
- Dark 2/Burgundy Print; Use SOLID Dark Blue
