We are very excited and looking forward to our February 14 guest speaker Michelle



Parker! Her hints and tricks should encourage more of us to create these for the upcoming expo in August.

"I started sewing in high school in Home Ec. I made lots of my clothes including prom dresses and drapes and curtains for my home. In 1997 I found a new love – auilting. I worked part-time at The Old Craft Store which fed my new love. In the early 2000's I was given the opportunity to teach beginner piecing classes. My focus for classes has always been teaching the fundamentals. Over the years in my personal quilting I found I really enjoyed small piecing and have continued to perfect my skills in miniatures. Funny how I was drawn to small piecing as the eyes and fingers don't work as well as they used to.

Over the years, almost all the classes I taught were pattens I had written. In 2019, my professional life took a turn and I left the corporate world and began a longarm guilting business. I am blessed with the opportunity to be able to start this business and make my love of a quilting a full-time gig.

I'll focus on the fundamentals of small piecing and making miniature guilts. We'll address tools and skills that will make you more confident. We'll discuss cutting, pressing, sewing and even quilting. Yes, those are the same basics you need to piecing full size quilts but going smaller can present unexpected challenges. I'll have examples of simple miniatures and more challenging "have I lost my mind" miniature."

Kathy Brann (former member) passed on January 2nd following a long illness.


Thoughts and prayers for our dear President Dottie Hughes, her husband of 72 years **Bob**, passed away on January 15th.

- You can help cancer patients and their families by making a miniature guilt to be auctioned off during our annual quilt show where a percentage of proceeds goes to Cancer Care Services.
- You can make a quilt to be donated to Project Linus, Ronald McDonald House, or the Fisher House Veterans. These guilts are distributed to children and veterans in need of a reminder that someone cares and that they are loved.

Sue's niece is now in remission and has been a part of numerous fundraisers for St. Jude raising thousands of dollars.

This guilt was made by Janice Mowery and gifted to Janice's grandson's halfbrother Nathan. Nathan served in the Army for six years including tours overseas in Afghanistan. He wrote Janice a very touching Thank You letter expressing his appreciation.



As you know, we auction miniature quilts at our show every year as a fund raiser. In 2022, we offered these miniature works of art to our members first.
