The half square triangles are 2.5 inches for a finished block size of 8.5 inches. Let's all help Dottie make this a quilt to remember us by!

Since we did not have any Sunshine for January or February, I couldn't let another month go without something good to report! So, my sunshine is




that my quilt 'Plain and Fancy' was chosen by Sewing Expo to travel from March through November! I was shocked to say the least. Let me know if there are others traveling!

# MQP Military Quilt Project

When I delivered the guilts to Fisher House in Dallas I was able to speak with the house manager about receiving guilts in the future. I am looking forward to our Guild having an ongoing arrangement with the Fisher House! They love the red, white, and blue guilts. She requested that the quilts be washed before being donated. If you are unable to wash your quilt, please don't let that stop you from donating, we will work it out. I also have labels to go on the quilts and it would be very helpful to me if you could attach one to your quilt before turning it in. A note with your name pinned to the guilt would also be appreciated as I try to keep a record of quilts received each year and who donated them. Now to stitch up some hugs and encouragement!

Recommend size is 55 x 65 to 72 x 90, ideal size 55 x 65

I have donated fabric, various sizes and colors, also some backing, fabric which is mostly red, or blue solid. If you would like to do a quilt for Snowball Express and need some fabrics this fabric is

If you make a top and are unable to quilt it, we have a few longarm quilters who will usually take on a few.

After the quilting you can finish with the binding and the label.
