Guest Speaker on April 11 LISA ERLANDSON Northern Lady or Southern Belle?



Lisa Erlandson is a compulsive quilt collector, with an extensive collection of antique quilts, whose habit has led to several quilt-related specialties. She is an AQS Certified Appraiser of Quilted Textiles, lecturer, quilt show judge, teacher, and quilt historian. She also owns LeRetreat House in Gainesville, Texas.

She learned to sew as a child, re-discovered sewing in the mid-1980s as a drama teacher, and made her first quilt in 1991. She taught junior high school, high school and college before deciding to focus on the quilt world. She has spoken internationally and teaches and lectures at venues from small local guilds to national quilt shows. She also judges quilt shows ranging from county fairs to statewide shows. She is a past president of the American Quilt Study Group.

In her program, she will explain that here was more than just the Mason-Dixon Line that divided the North and South. This program compares and contrasts quilts from the 19th century in design, style, and fabric to examine the regional differences of our quilting ancestors.

MQP - Military Quilt Project

What is the Military Quilt Project? What started with a request for quilts to be delivered to Brooks Army Hospital in San Antonio in November of 2005 has developed into our Military Quilt Project.

As the need for quilts at Brooks for wounded military personnel dropped and the difficulty of getting quilts to them increased, we began looking for a need closer to home. We have delivered quilts to the Dallas Veteran's Hospital, a local VFW Post to take to a veteran's home and sent out to Semper Fi caseworkers to be handed out at Christmas. For the last three years our quilts have gone to the Fisher House in Dallas. Fisher House is for veterans receiving care at the hospital but not admitted.

They love the red, white, and blue ones and are so grateful to receive them! They ask that we laundry the quilts before we bring them. I have printed labels available and would appreciate it if you could help me out by sewing a label on the quilt before you turn it in.

While any size is great, the following sizes are suggested 55 x 65 to 72 x 90, ideal size 55×65

If you have made a top and are unable to quilt it, we have a few wonderful longarm quilters that will help with a fewl Once quilted you can finish with the binding and a label. Need fabric? Give me a call! I have fabric that has been donated for these quilts as well as quilts for Snowball Express. Many hands make light work. Cindy Bergman


