

Give me a call! I have fabric that has been donated for these guilts as well as quilts for Snowball Express. Snowball Express is a weeklong camp for children who lost a parent in the line of duty. 

Friendship Stitchers Latest Project

Friendship stitchers has been working on a group quilt that is being submitted as a donation to the 2023 Ovarian Cancer Quilt Project sponsored by MD Anderson Cancer Center. All the fabric was donated by members and we spent a meeting day cutting the fabric for the blocks which were then taken home by members to piece together and assemble into rows. Jolene Mershon cut all the sashing and binding. Then we designated a sewing day for one of our meeting days where all the rows of blocks were put together with the sashing. Judy O'Polka, Sherry Livingston and Barb Cain did all the sewing as Randa Dillon and Judy Liston pinned, Kandy Garrett kept all the seams pressed as they progressed. We finished the top in one meeting! The quilt was then sent home with Nancy Spell to quilt. She then handed it off to Heather Schneider to do the machine sewing for the binding and Ching Ling Herbert finished the binding with all the handwork. The sleeve and label were then attached by Liz Cooper and Judy Liston, Rose Kauhane took a picture of the quilt with Friendship to show our project to the rest of the QGOA guild. The quilt is ready to be mailed before the June 30 deadline.

The whole project was a collaboration, from picking a pattern to voting on a title for the quilt, The pattern we decided on is called Elephant Parade, designed by Dana Bolyard from The *Big Book of Fat-Quarter Quilts*. It measures 63 ½ Inches X 77 ½ inches. The group decided on the title Friendship Ribbons for the quilt. With most members contributing their time and fabric we have been able to finish the project, and hope that it is purchased for a good price so as to raise money for Ovarian Cancer research at the upcoming auction of the Ovarian Cancer Quilt Project.
