THE SQUARE BEAR CHALLENGE

The EtCetera Art Quilt group had a challenge to use a Square Bear designed by Jane Kee, a former member of the group. We had just a few requirements though...

The size of the quilt was to be 34X36 inches in portrait mode so that they would hang together well. The bear was to be presented upright and the word Bear was to be used in the title of the quilt.

Donna's bear was dancing on a pole, Debby's bear was a take on the Beatle's song "Strawbeary Fields", Jennie's bear was a nod to the Charmin Bear and Mr. Whipple, Denny's bear was a burly biker bear complete with chest hair, Rose's bear was made from yo-yo's and was a riff on the book "Brown Bear, Brown Bear", Ruth's bear was full of symbolic star and astronomical symbols. Katie's bear was a riff on "My Fair Lady", Karen's bear was a reminder that love bears all things, and Rene's bear was a Honey Bear. Jane Kee also made one but unfortunately UPS lost it and we didn't receive it until the show was open. I have printed labels available and would appreciate it if you could help me out by sewing a label on the quilt before you turn it in.

While any size is great the following sizes are suggested. 55 x 65 to 72 x 90, ideal size 55 x 65

If you have made a top and are unable to quilt it, we have a few wonderful longarm quilters that will help with a few. Once quilted you can finish with the binding and a label. Many hands make light work.

It is a new month and Project Linus is back to The regular meetings (2nd Thursday monthly) at Westminster Presbyterian Church Trail Lake Drive Ft. Worth Texas. We meet at 9 and finish up about 3. As a reminder we take our machines and whatever you wish to work on or there are plenty of quilts and crochet things provided by our hard working ladies. If you have something to donate please bring it with you. We sew edges of quilt sandwiches and turn right side out and close and top stitch the outer edge and then they get tied by more lovely folks. Lots of hard work with about 300 blankets a month, each month. We take a lunch or there are places near there to pick up something to eat. We have started doing "show and tell" in the morning about 10:30 so those blankets can be inspected by our checkers (for strings or needed repairs). There are also machines manned by folks sewing on project Linus labels. So it is a lovely day with lots of laughs and hard sewing which we all love to do. This is an incredible community support group for all the ill children in Tarrant county. Please try to join us.
