Facings give you a beautiful, crisp, clean, knife edge finish to your quilts. They are great to use in a number of situations where you don't want the binding to show:

When you have a landscape quilt with a picture that could go on forever, and you don't want to frame it; when you want to set in a trim along the out edge of a quilt; when you have multiple colors along the outer edge of a traditional border; when you want a scalloped edge...or an unusually shaped edge.

There are many methods for facing a quilt; this is what works best for me.

I have included information on straight mitered facings, scalloped facings and how to draw scallops to fit your quilt and how to face unusually shaped edges on your quilts
